SIR,

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your Despatch No. 54 of the 23rd. May forwarding a Memorial addressed to my predecessor by certain Merchants Land Owners and others resident in Western Australia praying that a Sanitarium may be established in that Colony for Invalid Soldiers of Her Majesty's Forces serving in India.

As the decision of this question must obviously turn on the convenience and advantage of Sick Officers and Men of Her Majesty's Army, I caused the Memorial to be referred for the consideration of the Secretary of State for War, and I have to acquaint you that Earl de Grey has informed me in reply, that he cannot alter the conclusion which was formerly arrived at on this subject, and which was conveyed to your predecessor in the Duke of Newcastle's Despatch No. 33 of the 28th of June, 1860.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same.

THEREAS it is enacted by the fourth section of an Ordinance passed in the nineteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 12, intituled "An Ordinance for the better Registration "of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in the "Colony of Western Australia," that the Governor with the Advice of the Executive Council may for the purposes of such Ordinance divide the said Colony into such and so many Registry Districts as he shall think fit, one of them being the Registry District of Perth, and may in like manner by any subsequent Proclamations from time to time to alter such division. And whereas it is expedient to alter the division of some Registry Districts and to establish an entirely new district in manner hereafter appearing: Now therefore, I John Stephen Hampton the Governor aforesaid with the advice of the Executive Council do hereby proclaim that in addition to the districts already proclaimed there shall be a district to be called Beverley according to the boundaries hereinafter described, and the several other districts hereinafter specified according to the following altered boundaries thereof, shall be considered as Registry Districts for the purposes of the said Ordinance.

Beverley Registration District.

Bounded on the North by a line extending East $27\frac{1}{2}$ degrees North to the Avon River, through the northern boundary of Avon location **q**. then by the said river downwards, and by a line parrellel to the above through the northern boundary of Avon location E; on the East by a line extending South $27\frac{1}{2}$ degrees East to a spot 20 miles East $27\frac{1}{2}$ degrees North from County Peak, and then by a South line; on the South by a West line to where the Albany Road from Beverley crosses the Hotham River; and on the West by part of a North-westerly line from said crossing towards Mount Dale,—all lines true.

Guildford Registration District,

Bounded on the West by the Sea Coast; on the South by an East line through the North end of Lake Nowergup, then by a South line through the East end of Lake Gnangarra, then by a South-east line to Swan River's right bank at the upper boundary of Peninsula Farm, then by the upper boundary of Swan location 34, known as Belmont, and then by a South-easterly line to Mount Dale; on the East by a northerly line from Mount Dale to the old half-way house on a branch of Helena River (inclusive) on the York Road from Guildford, thence to Bailup (exclusive) on the Toodyay Road, thence to South-west corner of Goyamin and thence to Chandala Spring; and on the North by a West line from Chandala Spring to the Sea Coast,—all lines true.

Fremantle Registration District,

Bounded on the West by the Sea Coast; on the South by a true East line from the South extremity of Mangles Bay to the Albany Road from Kelmscott; on the East by a North-westerly line thence to Southwest corner of Bull's Creek; and on the North by Bull's Creek, by the Canning River and Swan Inlet, and by the East and North boundaries of North Fremantle Townsite, excluding from the foregoing area a portion of the Serpentine Registry District lying East of T. Peel's Cockburn Sound location No. 16, and South of an East line from the North-east corner of that location. The Fremantle District includes also Rottnest, Carnac, and Garden Islands.

Melbourne Registration District.

Bounded on the West by the Sea Coast; on the North by an East line from said Coast through a spot 20 miles North from Dandaraga Spring; on the South by an East line from Coast aforesaid to Jilgin Pool in Moore River, thence by a straight line to junction of Fletcher Brook with Moore River at Mouerin, thence by a straight line towards Bindoon, and by an East line to a spot 5 miles East from Yoolgan Spring; and on the East by a North line from spot last aforesaid,—all lines true.

Perth Registration District,

Bounded on the West by the Sea Coast; on the South by the North and East boundaries of North Fremantle Townsite, then by the southern shores of the Swan Inlet and of the Canning River to the South-west corner of Bull's Creek, then by a South-easterly line to that part of the Albany Road from Kelmscott lying East from the South extremity of Mangles Bay; on the East by a North-easterly line to Mount Dale, then by a North-westerly line to the East corner of Swan location 34 known as Belmont, then by the North-east boundary of said location 34 prolonged North-west to the Swan River's right bank, then by a line extending North by West to the East end of Lake Gnangarra, and then by a North line; and on the North by a West line to the Sea Coast through the North end of Lake Nowergup, excluding from the foregoing area a portion of the Serpentine Registry District lying to South of an East line from North-east cornor of T. Peel's Cockburn Sound location No. 16,-all bearings true.

Toodyay Registration District. Bounded on the North by an East and West line through the summit of Wongan Hills; on the West by a South line to a spot 5 miles East from Yoolgan Spring, then by a West line, and by part of a line extending Southerly from Mouerin at the mouth of Fletcher Brook to South-east corner of the Bindoon grant, then by a Southerly line to South-east corner of Goyamin grant, and by a South-easterly line towards the South-west corner of the Bailup grant, on the Toodyay Road from Guildford; on the South by a line extending East 271 degrees North through the Northern boundary of Avon location U, and on the East by part of a line between summit of Wongan Hills and the summit of Cunderdin Hill,-all lines true.

York Registration District. Bounded on the North by a line extending East 271 degrees North through the Northern boundaries of Avon locations f and J on the Avon River; on the West by a line between the old half-way house on the York Road from Guildford, and the summit of Mount Dale, and by part of a South-easterly line from said Mount to where the Albany Road from Beverley crosses the Hotham River; on the South by a line extending East $27\frac{1}{2}$ degrees North to the Avon River through the Northern boundary of Avon location q, then by Avon River downwards and by a line extending East 271 degrees North through Northern boundary of Avon location E, and on the East by part of a line between summit of Wongan Hills and Cunderdin Hill, and from Cunderdin Hill, towards a spot 20 miles East 27½ degrees North from County Peak, all lines true.

CONVEYANCE OF MAILS.

Between Busselton and Quindalup (Saw Mill Station) either once or twice a week

(on horseback.)

Between Perth and Wanerenooka viâ Gingin, Moore River, Yatheroo, Irwin River, Greenough and Champion Bay once a month (in a spring cart or on horseback)

Between Champion Bay and Port Gregory, once a month (on horseback.)

Tenders offering to convey a mail in a spring cart will be preferred to those stipulating for its conveyance on horseback, where spring cart conveyance is to be used the contractor will occasionally on the requisition of the Postmaster General, be required to provide an Officer of the Post Office Department with a free passage.

The arrival and departure of Mails will be subject to instructions from the Postmaster General, and liable to alteration at

any time during the year.

Two approved sureties will be required to join the contractors in a guarantee for the due fulfilment of the duties respectively

contracted to be performed.

No payment will be made on account of any mail contract until the Bond has been signed by the contractor and his sureties, and any breach of contract in the wilful or negligent departure or delivery of the mails at the appointed days and hours will subject the contractor to the loss of a proportionate part of his pay, or the cancellation of his contract.

The contractors are to convey and deliver all mails which may be entrusted to them under the authority of the Postmaster General, or any of the Postmasters, and to provide, secure and water-tight lockers for mails in carts, and coverings for bags on horseback. The contractors moreover will be bound not to convey themselves, nor permit their servants to convey any letter or packet to the prejudice of the Post Office Reveuue, under a penalty of £3, which penalty will be deducted from

their monthly pay,

The persons employed by the contractors to convey the mails are to be subject to the approval of the Postmaster General both as

to age and character.
