CONVEYANCE OF MAILS.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, 20th September, 1864.

TENDERS (in duplicate) endorsed "Tenders for conveyance of Mail," (as the case may be), will be received at this Office until noon on Thursday, the 17th November, next, for the conveyance of the following Mails for three years, viz: from the 1st January, 1865 to the 31st December, 1867, (excepting Port Gregory, and Quindalup Mails which will be for 12 months only).

Between Perth and the half-way tree on the Fremantle road twice daily (in a spring cart or on horseback.)

Between Fremantle and the half-way tree on the Perth road, twice daily (in a spring cart or on horseback.

Between Guildford and Perth, once daily (in a spring cart.)

Between Guildford and York, twice a week (in a spring cart.)

Between Guildford and Newcastle twice a week (in a spring cart.)

Between York and Newcastle via Northam twice a week (on horse back or in a spring cart.)

Between Guildford and Upper Swan, once a week (on horse back.)

Between Bunbury and Blackwood once a fortnight (in a spring cart or on horse back.)

Between Perth and Busselton vià Pinjarrah, Australind and Bunbury, once a week (in a spring cart or on horseback.)

Between *Perth and Busselton* via Mandurah, Australind and Bunbury, once a week (in a spring cart or on horse back.)

Between Busselton and Quindalup (Saw Mill Station) either once or twice a week

(on horseback.) Between Perth and Wanerenooka vià Gingin, Moore River, Yatheroo, Irwin River, Greenough and Champion Bay once a month (in a spring cart or on horseback) Between Champion Bay and Port Gre-

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gory, once a month (on horseback.)

Tenders offering to convey a mail in a spring cart will be preferred to those stipulating for its conveyance on horseback, where spring cart conveyance is to be used the contractor will occasionally on the requisition of the Postmaster General, be required to provide an Officer of the Post Office Department with a free passage.

The arrival and departure of Mails will be subject to instructions from the Postmaster General, and liable to alteration at any time during the year.

Two approved sureties will be required to join the contractors in a guarantee for the due fulfilment of the duties respectively contracted to be performed.

No payment will be made on account of any mail contract until the Bond has been signed by the contractor and his sureties, and any breach of contract in the wilful or negligent departure or delivery of the mails at the appointed days and hours will subject the contractor to the loss of a proportionate part of his pay, or the cancellation of his contract.

The contractors are to convey and deliver all mails which may be entrusted to them under the authority of the Postmaster General, or any of the Postmasters, and to provide, secure and water-tight lockers for mails in carts, and coverings for bags on horseback. The contractors moreover will be bound not to convey themselves, nor permit their servants to convey any letter or packet to the prejudice of the Post Office Reveuue, under a penalty of £3, which penalty will be deducted from their monthly pay,

The persons employed by the contractors to convey the mails are to be subject to the approval of the Postmaster General both as to age and character. Further particulars may be obtained on reference to the Postmaster General, at whose Office Forms of Tender may be had as well as from the Resident Magistrates.

Firewood, at per cord, to consist of Banksia and She Oak in equal proportions, to be stacked by the contractors, and subject to measurement on delivery.

The Government reserve the right to cancel the contract for Meat at the end of March, 1865, if they think it desirable to do so.
