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PROCLAMATION.

*By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same.*

WHEREAS the undermentioned Ordinances were passed by me the said Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, in the 28th Year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and intitled :—

No. 3. An Ordinance for securing to Alfred Carson, for a limited period the exclusive benefit of a certain Invention.

No. 4. An Ordinance for protecting the Oyster Fisheries on the Coast of this Colony.

No. 5. An Ordinance to amend "The Insolvent Ordinance 1863."

No. 6. An Ordinance to amend "The Jury Ordinance 1858."

No. 7. An Ordinance to rectify a Clerical error in the Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to amend the Colonial Passengers Ordinance 1861."

No. 9. An Ordinance for extending the limits of St. Georges Terrace in the City of Perth, and for appropriating a portion of Spring Street in the same City.

No. 10. An Ordinance to amend "The City of Perth Improvement Ordinance 1858."

No. 12. An Ordinance to amend the Police Ordinance, 1861.

No. 13. An Ordinance to consolidate and amend the Laws to regulate the Branding of live stock.

No. 14. An Ordinance to amend "The Cattle Trespass Ordinance 1857."

No. 15. An Ordinance to provide summary redress in cases of minor trespasses.

NOW THEREFORE, I the said Governor do hereby proclaim and make known to all to whom it may concern that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the same.
