### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in and over the Territory of Western Australia, and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same.

W HEREAS by an Ordinance of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, made and passed in the Twenty Seventh Year of the Reign of Her Most Gracious Majesty, Queen Victoria, No. 1, entitled "An Ordinance for the recovery of Small Debts and Demands,"—the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to constitute Local Courts for the recovery of Small Debts and Demands, to be holden at such times and places, and within such districts throughout the said Colony as may be most fit and convenient. Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, do hereby notify and proclaim, and do hereby constitute a Local Court for the recovery of Small Debts and Demands, to be holden on the first Wednesday in each Month, at the hour of Eleven o'clock in the forenoon, in the Town of Elliot, at Port Camden in the North District.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Western Australia, and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same,

HEREAS by "the Customs Ordinance, 1860," it is amongst other thing enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to establish a New Port or Ports as to him may seem meet by Proclamation, to be published in the Government Gazette.

And Whereas a settlement has been formed at Camden Sound, on the North West Coast of the Territory of the said Colony, and it is expedient to establish a Port thereat, Now therefore I, the said Governor by virtue and in exercise of the authority aforesaid, do hereby proclaim that I have established Camden Sound and other the waters and places adjacent thereto comprised within the limits next hereinafter described to be a Port of the said Colony for all the purposes of the said Ordinance. And I further proclaim that the said Port shall be bounded on the West by a line from the West end of the Champagny Isles to Point Hall, on the South and East by the Sea shore from Point Hall to the East corner of Camden Harbor, then by an Easterly line thence to the South end of Augustus Water and by the East shore of the said water northwards to Point Augustus, and on the North by a Westerly line to Point Frederick, then by the Seacoast Northwes-terly to Point Adieu, and thence by a Westerly line to Red Island, and by a Southwesterly line to Westward of the Champagny Ísles aforesaid.
