PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice Admiral of the same.

HEREAS the undermentioned Ordinances were passed by me the said Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of the said Colony in the 27th and 28th years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and entituled :-

No. 5. "An Ordinance to grant Facilities for depositing Small Savings at Interest with the security of the Government for repayment thereof." 1st July, 1863.

No. 1. "An Ordinance to "Amend the Post Office Savings' Bank Ordinance." 11th July 1864.

No. 8. "An Ordinance to Confirm the Expenditure for the services of the year 1863 beyond the grant for that year." 11th July 1864.

Now therefore, I the said Governor do hereby proclaim and make known to all to whom it may concern that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the same.
