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PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS the undermentioned Ordinance was passed by me the said Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of the said Colony in the 28th Year of the Reign of Her Majesty, Queen Victoria, and entitled:

No. 11.—“An Ordinance to appropriate the sum of Seventy four thousand and thirty eight pounds, out of the General Revenue of the Colony, for the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty five.”

Now therefore, I, the said Governor do hereby proclaim and make known to all to whom it may concern that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the same.
