I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your Despatch No. 63, dated the 22nd April last, enclosing a letter from Mr. Maitland Brown containing an account, given by Natives, of the murder of Messrs. Panter, Harding, and Goldwyer.

I have read with great regret this report of their melancholy fate.

Sir.

In my Despatch of the 26th November last No, 43, I stated that Her Majesty's Government intended to propose to Par-liament measures which if adopted would in the short period of Three years render it unnecessary any longer to continue Transportation to Western Australia.

I have now to inform you that Parliament has passed the Vote for the enlargement of Prisons in England, which was included in the Estimates of this year, and that accordingly it is not intended after the expiration of Three years from the date of my Despatch above referred to, to send any more Convicts to Western Australia.
