I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your Despatch No. 68, of the 24th of April, forwarding for my information, with other documents, a letter from the Resident Magistrate at Camden Harbour, reporting upon the state of affairs at that Settlement up to the 17th of March.

I regret that the accounts which you transmit of the surrounding country, so far as it is at present known, are not more satisfactory, and shall await with much interest and anxiety a further report from you on the subject

Government House, Perth, 13th October, 1865. "I have the honor to acknowledge "the receipt of your Despatch, No. 82, "of the 23rd of May, informing me of the "discovery of the remains of Messrs. "Panter, Harding, and Goldwyer, which "had been brought to Perth, and buried "at the public expense.

"It is a melancholy satisfaction to "have been made acquainted with the "actual fate of men to whom the Colony has been so much indebted, and to have been enabled to pay to their remains the "last tribute of respect. For this satisfaction the Colony is indebted to the courage, the perseverance, and the skill of Mr. Maitland Brown, and those by "whom he was accompanied, and you have done well to recognise by a public act the performance of a service, which "you inform me has been duly appreciated "throughout the Colony."

OTICE is hereby given that, under instructions from Her Majesty's Secretary of State for the Colonies, a Conditional Pardon will not be granted to any Convict who may have arrived in Western Australia subsequently to the 13th November 1863; and instead thereof such Convict may receive a conditional release (ticket-of-leave 14th Vict. No. 6 of 1850) subject to the following Rules and Regulations, which His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to approve, with the advice of the Executive Council.

- 1. The minimum period, with uniformly good conduct, to be served by a Convict to render him eligible for a conditional release, will be half the period of his sentences remaining unexpired at the time he is granted an ordinary Ticket-of-Leave,
- 2. A conditional release will not exempt the holder from the summary jurisdiction of Magistrates under the Convict discipline Ordinances; it will merely relieve him from the general Ticket-of-Leave Regulations, and he will be required to report himself personally or by letter to the Police on his leaving a District to reside clsewhere, and on his entering a District to reside in it.
- 3. All sentences for misconduct, misdemeanor, or any serious offence passed on a Convict holding a conditional release will be cumulative upon, and in addition to, his original sentence, and on the expiration of his Magisterial sentence he will revert to his original sentence, and will not be released except on the special order of the Governor.
- A convict holding a conditional release must not proceed to either of the newly discovered Districts to the North and East.
