**ROAD between MANDURAH FERRY
and mouth of MURRAY RIVER.**

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that a Road is about to be cleared and opened for traffic between the East shore of Peel Inlet and the mouth of the Murray River.

The said road will be one-half of a chain in width, and will pass due east along the south side of the north boundary of what is known as the Ferry Acre, at the eastern end of the Mandurah Ferry, and to the S.E. corner of Lytton's Acre, adjoining the said Ferry Acre. Thence it will take a direction about 30 degrees eastward of South along, or nearly along, the present rack to the northern shore of the Murray Estuary, and will pass to the east of Creary's homestead. Following the shore of the Estuary to the eastward, the road will cross the mouth of the River Surpentine by the ford now in use, and will come out on the north side of the northern mouth of the River Murray.

FREE PARDON TO AN ACCOMPLICE.

Wellington, October 11th, 1865.*

WHEREAS, on Monday, the 4th day of September, 1865, Mr. WALMSLEY, of the Bank of New South Wales, was attacked and robbed, about 12 o'clock in the day, by about four or five armed men, between No Town and the Twelve-Mile, on the Grey River Gold Fields, in the Province of Nelson, about 14 miles distant from the Grey Mouth, in the Province of Canterbury, of 821 ounces of Gold Dust and about £1000 in Bank-Notes.

This is to Notify that His Excellency the Governor will grant a Free Pardon to any person implicated in the robbery aforesaid, who shall give such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of any one or more of the other offenders.
