By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor, and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

HEREAS the undermentioned Ordinances were passed by me the said Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, in the 29th year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and respectively intituled:—

- No. 1.—"An Ordinance to explain an Ordinance to regulate Friendly Societies."
- No. 2.—"An Ordinance to amend an Ordinance to facilitate the sale of Colonial Wine."
- No. 3.—" An Ordinance to prevent the introduction into Western Australia of infectious or contagious diseases amongst Cattle"
- No. 4.—"An Ordinance to impose certain Fees on Licenses for Carriages in the City of Perth.
- No. 5.—" An Ordinance to consolidate and amend the Statute Laws and Ordinances relating to Criminal offences."
- No. 6.—" An Ordinance to naturalize Isidro Oriol."
- No. 7.—"An Ordinance to regulate the payment of Jurors serving in the Court of General Sessions at Albany."
- No. 8.—"An Ordinance to explain and amend the Law for facilitating the Recovery of Debts."

No. 9.—"An Ordinance to regulate the admission in the Supreme Court of Attorneys and Solicitors, there to practise as Barristers, Attorneys, Solicitors and Proctors."

NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, do hereby proclaim and make known to all whom it may concern that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the same.

T is hereby notified, for general information, that the undermentioned Roads will shortly be laid out for public use.

- 1.—A Road one chain wide, extending magnetic East North East from the public road between York and Northam, gazetted and declared on the 7th day of April, 1855, to the north corner of Avon location J; the middle of the road No. 1 being the dividing boundary line between locations K, 448 and 430 on the North, and location J on the South.
- 2.—A Branch from Road No. 1, 25 links wide, extending magnetic North North West from it to location 365, along the eastern side of the east boundary of location K.
- 3.—A Branch from Road No. 1, 25 links wide, extending magnetic North North West from it to location 238, along the western side of the west boundary of location 430.
- 4.—A Branch from Road No. 1, 25 links wide, extending magnetic North North West from it, and passing through the west side of tillage lease 3408 to south corner of location 247.

The Roads above described will be carried as nearly as practicable along the lines indicated, without interfering with any existing improvements; and are intended to supersede those described in a Gazette Notice under the above heading dated 24th November, 1865; which Notice is hereby cancelled.
