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PROCLAMATION.

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By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

HEREAS, by the "Customs Ordinance, 1860," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to establish a New Port or Ports, as to him may seem meet, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette.

AND WHEREAS a Settlement has been formed in the vicinity of Cape Lambert, on the North-west Coast of the Territory of the said Colony, and it is expedient to establish a Port thereat; Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, by virtue and in exercise of the authority aforesaid, do hereby proclaim that I have established the waters and places next hereinafter described to be a Port of the said Colony for all the purposes of the said Ordinance, and under the name and designation of Port WALCOTT; And I further proclaim that the said Port shall be bounded on the South and on the West by the seacoast, westward from the mouth of Sherlock River to the North end of Dolphin Island, including all the intermediate bays, creeks, coves, inlets, and navigable waters; on the North by lines extending easterly from north end of Dolphin Island, to south end of Legendre Island, and thence to north end of Delambre Island, and thence south-easterly to north end of the east boundary herein next described, and on the East by a straight line extending five statute miles true north from the sea mouth of Sherlock River aforesaid.

I DO HEREBY notify and proclaim that the Regulations hereunto annexed are and shall be the Regulations to be observed for the preservation of the Jetties at Bunbury and Busselton, until altered or amended as occasion may require.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!!!

Regulations for the management of the Jetties at Bunbury and Busselton.

- 1. Goods may be landed at the Jetties any hour after sunrise and before sunset.
- 2. No Vessel or Cargo Boat shall be fastened to any part of the Public Jetties at Bunbury and Busselton, except to such ringbolts or other fastenings as are or may be provided for the purpose, and no Vessel or Cargo Boat shall lie alongside of the Jetties unless so fastened. All Vessels, Cargo Boats, or Flats. so fastened shall also be anchored in such a manner as to relieve the Jetties as much as possible from the weight of such Craft.
- 3. No Vessel or Cargo Boat shall be so fastened, except for the purpose of loading or unloading; nor for any longer period than shall be reasonably required for such purpose.
- 4. Passenger Boats, only, shall lie alongside the steps, and for no longer period than may be necessary to embark or disembark passengers.
- 5 No Vessel, Cargo Boat, or Flat shall make fast or be alongside the Jetties for the purpose of discharging or taking in cargo after sunset or before sunrise.
- 6. No fishing, whatever, allowed off Jetties.
- 7. No stone, bricks, clay, sand, lime, coal, coke, or other fuel, or timber in logs, are to be loaded or unloaded on the Jetties, except imported bricks and paving stones, which must be removed immediately.
- 8. All goods are to be removed from the Jetties before sunset.
- 9. No Gunpowder shall be landed or left on the Jetties without a Keeper, nor without being well covered with a Tarpaulin.
- 10. All goods landed at Bunbury and Busselton from the sea to be landed at the Jetties; and Boatmen are to expose to view the marks and numbers of all packages so landed; and no goods to be landed at any other place without first obtaining permission of the Collector of Customs.
- 11. No goods shall be landed on the Jetties on Sunday, except in cases of extreme emergency; the permission of the Resident Magistrate being first obtained.
- 12. No stones or other kind of substance whatever shall be thrown into the water from the Jetties, or from Boats lying along side of them.
- 13. No fire shall be made on or near the Jetties.

ROAD between FREMANTLE and PINJARRA,

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, 2nd January, 1866.

T is hereby notified for general information, that it is the intention of the Government to lay out, clear and make, as soon as convenient, a line of road between Fremantle and Pinjarra, viâ Stake Hill and the Serpentine and Dandalup bridges, with a view to the same being opened for use as a public line of communication, pursuant to the provisions of existing Ordinances, in lieu of the line described in a Gazette Notice dated 1st July, 1863, which is hereby cancelled.

The road will be one chain wide, commencing at south end of South Terrace, Fremantle, and extending southerly, as already surveyed and laid out, to location 101, where it joins another surveyed branch extending southerly from Fremantle through locations 7, 38, 128, 113, 126, 87, 101, 85, and 102. From south boundary of 102 the road will take a southerly dierction through locations 13 and 14 near Brown Hill, then pass southerly outside the west boundary of location 129, and thence to the north-west corners of locations 121, 137 and 64, and to the east boundary of location 130. Thence entering location 16, and passing through it southerly between Lakes Coolungup and Walyungup, and near Stake Hill, the road will cross the bridge over the Serpentine, and 8 miles further S.E. by S. that over the Dandalup; whence, in $2\frac{3}{4}$ further South, it will reach the bridge over the Murray at Pinjarra.

The above road will pass as near as may be found desirable along the tracks at present in use; and parties are warned against fencing across or otherwise obstructing these tracks, until the permanent lines may be finally laid out and cleared.
