#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor, and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

HEREAS by "The Police Ordinance 1861" section 50, it is enacted that on complaint made to any Justice being a Resident or Police Magistrate, by any person who shall within the City of Perth or Town of Fremantle respectively, have occupied any house or lodging by the week or month, whereof the Rent does not exceed the rate of fifteen pounds by the year, such Justice shall have power to deal summarily with cases arising out of distresses and otherwise as mentioned in the said section. And whereas also by the same Ordinance, section 51, it is also enacted that upon complaint made to any Justice being a Resident or Police Magistrate by any person claiming to be entitled to the property or possession of any Goods which are detained by any other person within the Police Districts of Perth and Fremantle respectively, the value of which shall not be greater than fifteen pounds, and not being deeds, muniments, or papers relating to any property of greater value than fifteen pounds, it shall be lawful for such Justice to summon the person com-plained of and to deal with such complaint as is mentioned in the said section. And whereas also by the same Ordinance section 75, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council from time to time by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette to extend all or any part or parts of the said Ordinance not otherwise extended to any Town, place, or district, or throughout the Colony. And whereas I, the said Governor have, with the advice of the Executive Council, determined to extend throughout the Colony the provisions of the said sections of the said Ordinance so as aforesaid limited to the City, Town, and Police districts aforesaid.

Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, pursuant to the authority in me vested in that behalf, do hereby notify and proclaim that the 50th and 51st sections of the recited "Police Ordinance 1861" shall extend throughout the Colony of Western Australia.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

LEADING LIGHTS AND BEACONS FOR NEWCASTLE.

In order to increase the facilities for navigating Newcastle Harbour, leading lights for entering, and also leading lights for taking the north channel, will be exhibited on and after Tuesday, the 1st of May, 1866.

The two fairway lights for entering (red and bright), will be shown from beacons 228 feet apart, in a S.W. ½ S., and N.E. ½ N. direction, erected on a clear space of ground on the hill at the back of the town, between the Wesleyan and Catholic Churches.

Those for taking the north channel, also red and bright, will be shown from beacons erected on the breakwater in the vicinity of the old Bull beacons, at a distance of a hundred feet apart, in a W. by N. and E. by S. direction.

In both cases, when the lights are in line, the bright will be the uppermost, and the red the lowermost, one of the two. In the day time, however, this order of colour will be reversed, as it is intended to paint the upper beacons red and the lower ones white.

The lower or north-eastern of the two obelisks at present used for the leading mark in, situated on Shepherd's Hill, will be removed, so likewise will be the remnant of the Bull beacons on the break-water.

The exhibition of these leading lights will not necessitate different sailing directions to those already published, any more than the lights and new beacons being substituted for the obelisks and beacons which are at present in use.

In entering the Port of Newcastle at night great caution will be necessary, in consequence of the strength of the tide, and due allowance will have to be made for ebb or flow, on sighting the north channel lights, and about to alter course from S.W. ½ S. with the fairway lights in one, to W. by N., the direction which a vessel will have to steer to keep the north channel lights in line, to gain an anchorage in the north harbour.
