**I** IS Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified for general information, that from and after this date, the following regulations in regard to persons in the public service of the Colony being provided with Medicines and medical advice, will take effect: 1. Persons in public employ, whose whole time is at the disposal of the Government, shall be entitled gratuitously to receive medicines and medical advice from the Colonial Medical Officers of the district in which they are stationed.

2. Persons in public employ, such as Postmasters, on trifling salaries, who are at the same time engaged in private business shall not be so entitled.

3. Where one member of a family, other than its head, is in full public employ, the boon of gratuitous medical advice and medicines shall be confined to that member alone.

4. All public servants, entitled to the above indulgence, whose salaries are under one hundred pounds per annum, must, when requiring medical advice, except in cases of emergency, attend personally at the residences or hospitals of the Medical Officers of their respective districts, at certain hours to be notified by such Medical Officers.

5. Public Officers residing at a distance of more than one mile from the boundary of any town in which a Medical Officer may be employed, must, on behalf of themselves and family personally communicate with Medical Officers at their respective residences, except in cases of emergency, when Medical Officers will proceed to their dwellings. In such cases, Medical Officers will provide their own means of transport, and be entitled to mileage at the rate of one shilling a mile one way and such actual expenses as they may incur during their absence from their proper place of residence.

Expenses so incurred will be paid from public funds on receipt of certificates from Medical Officers that the visits so paid, were absolutely emergent; failing such certificates, the expense will in each case be borne by the person requiring the attendance.

6. Medical Officers are exempted from attendance at the accouchement of the wives of public servants.
