IS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to appoint the Reverend A. K. MacSorley to be Chaplain at Albany vice the Reverend W. S. Meade resigned.

"Tenders for the Conveyance of the Albany Mail," will be received at this Office up to noon of Monday, the 19th November next, for the conveyance of Colonial and Foreign Mails between Perth and Albany, for three years, commencing on the 1st January, 1867.

Tenders to embrace the following points :---

- 1 For conveyance of a Monthly Mail from Perth to Albany, and vice versa, at per month.
- 2 For conveyance of Express Mails from Albany to Perth, at any time during the month (on being called upon to do so by the Postmaster at Albany), at per trip.;

and

3 For conveyance of a bi-monthly Mail from Perth to Albany, and vice versd, at per trip.

It is not intended to adopt the service named in No. 3 paragraph, unless bimonthly steam communication between England and the Australian Colonies is established, but in such event the accepted tender for a bi-monthly mail would be put into operation.

The Contractor to convey the Mails at such dates in each month as the Postmaster General shall fix. Parties tendering to state the time in which they will undertake to convey the Mails between Perth and Albany, and *vice versâ*.

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The tender stipulating to convey the Mail in the shortest time between the two places, will have the preference.

In case the Contractor should fail to deliver the Mails at either Perth or Albany within his contract time, in consequence of the overloading of the Mail Cart with Passengers or Luggage, &c., he will be liable to a penalty not exceeding $\pounds 20$, exclusive of any sum recoverable by his bond.

In the event of the Mail Packets discontinuing to touch at King George's Sound during the period of the contract, the unexpired portion of it to be cancelled.

The arrival and departure of the Mail will be subject to instructions from the Postmaster General, and liable to alteration at any time during the contract.

The Contractor will be required to provide an Officer of the Post Office with a free passage to and from Albany, if called upon to do so at any time by the Postmaster General.

Two approved sureties will be required to join the contractor in a guarantee for the due fulfilment of the duties contracted to be performed.

No payment will be made on account of the contract until the bond shall have been signed by the Contractor and his Sureties, and any breach of contract in the wilful or negligent departure of the Mail at the appointed days and hours will subject the contractor to the loss of a proportionate part of his monthly pay, or the cancellation of his contract.

The Contractor is to convey and deliver all Mails which may be intrusted to him under the authority of the Postmaster General, or the Postmaster at Albany, and to provide secure and water tight lockers for the Mails, and covering for the same. He will moreover be bound not to convey, or permit his servants to convey, any letter or packet to the prejudice of the Post Office Revenue under a penalty of £3 for each offence, which penalty will be deducted from his monthly pay.

The persons employed by the contractor to convey the mail are to be subject to the approval of the Postmaster General, both as to age and character.

"IENDERS (in duplicate) endorsed "Tenders for conveyance of the Mail," (as the case may be), will be received at this Office, until noon of Monday, the 19th November next, for the conveyance of the following Mails for one, two, or three years, commencing on the 1st January, 1867.

- 1 From Champion Bay to Wanerenooka, and vice versâ, once a week.
- 2 From Champion Bay to Greenough, and vice versâ, once a week.
- 3 From Wanerenooka to Geraldine Mines, and vice versa, once a month.
- 4 From *Fremantle* to *Rockingham*, and *vice verså*, once a week.
- 5 From Busselton to Quindalup, and vice versa, twice a week.
- 6 From Guildford to Victoria Plains via Gingin, and vice versa, twice a month.
- 7 From York to Beverley, and vice versa, once a week.

The arrival and departure of the Mails will be subject to instructions from the Postmaster General, and liable to alteration at any time during the year.

Two approved sureties will be required to join the Contractor in a guarantee for the due fulfilment of the duties contracted to be performed.

No payment will be made on account of any Mail contract until the Bond has been signed by the Contractor and his sureties, and any breach of Contract in the wilful or negligent departure or delivery of the Mails at the appointed days and hours will subject the Contractor to the loss of a proportionate part of his pay, or the cancellation of his Contract.

The Contractors are to convey and deliver all Mails which may be entrusted to them under the authority of the Postmaster General or any of the Postmasters, and to provide secure and water tight lockers for Mails where carts are used, and coverings for bags on horseback. The Contractors moreover will be bound not to convey, nor to permit their servants to convey, any letter or packet to the prejudice of the Post Office Revenue, under a penalty of £3 which penalty will be deducted from their monthly pay. The persons employed by the Contractors to convey the Mails are to be subject to the approval of the Postmaster General both as to age and character.
