Applications are frequently made by Colonial Officers on leave of absence, soliciting advances of salary in order to enable them to return to the scene of their

The practice of granting advances of salary to Public Officers is always inconvenient; but in the case of Officers who have come home on leave it is so peculiarly objectionable that its discontinuance has become necessary.

You will make known this decision in the Colony under your Government, in order that Officers coming home on leave may not make their arrangements in expectation of receiving such advances.

"Tenders for the Conveyance of the Albany Mail," will be received at this Office up to noon of Monday, the 19th November next, for the conveyance of Colonial and Foreign Mails between Perth and Albany, for three years, commencing on the 1st January, 1867.

Tenders to embrace the following points:—

- 1 For conveyance of a Monthly Mail from Perth to Albany, and vice versa, at per month.
- 2 For conveyance of Express Mails from Albany to Perth, at any time during the month (on being called upon to do so by the Postmaster at Albany), at per trip.;

and

3 For conveyance of a bi-monthly Mail from Perth to Albany, and vice versa, at per trip.

It is not intended to adopt the service named in No. 3 paragraph, unless bimonthly steam communication between England and the Australian Colonies is established, but in such event the accepted tender for a bi-monthly mail would be put into operation.

The Contractor to convey the Mails at such dates in each month as the Postmaster General shall fix.

Parties tendering to state the time in which they will undertake to convey the Mails between Perth and Albany, and vice versa.

The tender stipulating to convey the Mail in the shortest time between the two places, will have the preference.

In case the Contractor should fail to deliver the Mails at either Perth or Albany within his contract time, in consequence of the overloading of the Mail Cart with Passengers or Luggage, &c., he will be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20, exclusive of any sum recoverable by his bond.

In the event of the Mail Packets discontinuing to touch at King George's Sound during the period of the contract, the unexpired portion of it to be cancelled.

The arrival and departure of the Mail will be subject to instructions from the Postmaster General, and liable to alteration at any time during the contract.

The Contractor will be required to provide an Officer of the Post Office with a free passage to and from Albany, if called upon to do so at any time by the Postmaster General.

Two approved sureties will be required to join the contractor in a guarantee for the due fulfilment of the duties contracted to be performed.

No payment will be made on account of the contract until the bond shall have been signed by the Contractor and his Sureties, and any breach of contract in the wilful or negligent departure of the Mail at the appointed days and hours will subject the contractor to the loss of a proportionate part of his monthly pay, or the cancellation of his contract.

The Contractor is to convey and deliver all Mails which may be intrusted to him under the authority of the Postmaster General, or the Postmaster at Albany, and to provide secure and water tight lockers for the Mails, and covering for the same. He will moreover be bound not to convey, or permit his servants to convey, any letter or packet to the prejudice of the Post Office Revenue under a penalty of £3 for each offence, which penalty will be deducted from his monthly pay.

The persons employed by the contractor to convey the mail are to be subject to the approval of the Postmaster General, both as to age and character.

- 3 From Wanerenooka to Geraldine Mines, and vice versa, once a month.
- 4 From Fremantle to Rockingham, and vice versa, once a week.
- 5 From Busselton to Quindalup, and vice versa, twice a week.
- 6 From Guildford to Victoria Plains via Gingin, and vice versa, twice a month.
- 7 From York to Beverley, and vice versa, once a week.

The arrival and departure of the Mails will be subject to instructions from the Postmaster General, and liable to alteration at any time during the year.

Two approved sureties will be required to join the Contractor in a guarantee for the due fulfilment of the duties contracted to be performed.

No payment will be made on account of any Mail contract until the Bond has been signed by the Contractor and his sureties, and any breach of Contract in the wilful or negligent departure or delivery of the Mails at the appointed days and hours will subject the Contractor to the loss of a proportionate part of his pay, or the cancellation of his Contract.

The Contractors are to convey and deliver all Mails which may be entrusted to them under the authority of the Postmaster General or any of the Postmasters, and to provide secure and water tight lockers for Mails where carts are used, and coverings for bags on horseback. The Contractors moreover will be bound not to convey, nor to permit their servants to convey, any letter or packet to the prejudice of the Post Office Revenue, under a penalty of £3 which penalty will be deducted from their monthly pay.

The persons employed by the Contractors to convey the Mails are to be subject to the approval of the Postmaster General both as to age and character.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

ADDITIONAL LIGHT AT THE ENTRANCE TO GEELONG HARBOR; ALSO NOTICE OF ALTERA-TIONS IN BUOYS AND BEACONS, PORT PHILLIP BAY.

1. Notice is hereby given that the beacon on the north end of Symond's Spit has been washed away; another beacon will be placed on the same spit in a few days.

FRANKSTON JETTY.

2. The jetty at Frankston having now been extended into twelve feet water, the moorings and buoy have been removed.

BUOYS .- WEST CHANNEL.

3. As several vessels have of late got foul of, and done serious damage to, the Swan Bay and No. 12 Elbow buoys, it has been found necessary to shift the former close in shore. Masters of vessels and others navigating this channel are hereby informed, that the ascertained depth of the water, in a straight line from buoy to buoy, on both sides of the West Channel does not exceed sixteen feet. ceed sixteen feet.

LIGHT AT THE ENTRANCE OF THE GEELONG HARBOR.

4. With a view of facilitating the navigation of the channel into Geelong Harbor at night, a red light will, on and after the twenty-fourth day of next month, be exhibited from sunset to sunrise from a lantern placed on the first red dolphin, inshore of the light ship.
