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PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in and over the Territory of Western Australia and is Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

HEREAS the undermentioned Ordinances were passed by me the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, in the 31st year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and respectively intituled :—

No. 4. "An Ordinance to reduce the Duty on the Importation of Tobacco intended for Sheep Wash."

No. 6. "An Ordinance for the protection of Her Majesty's Naval and Victualling Stores."

No. 9. "An Ordinance to amend an Ordinance intituled 'An Ordinance to incorporate the National Bank of Australasia and for other purposes'."

Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, do hereby proclaim and make known unto all whom it may concern, that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the same.

General Post Office, Perth, 14th January, 1868.

T is hereby notified for general information that Her Majesty's Postmaster General has concluded a new Contract with the P. & O. Company for the Mail Service between the United Kingdom and India and China.

Commencing next month, the Indian Mails are to be despatched from London on a fixed day in every week, and Mails for Point de Galle and China will be made up with the Indian Mails in every alternate week.

With every alternate Mail to Point de Galle Mails for the several Australian Colonies will be despatched from London, so that Australian Mails will be made up once in four weeks instead of once in a Calendar Month as at present.

The return Mails for England will, in like manner, be made up in Australia on fixed days in every fourth week, instead of on certain days of the month.

Consequent on these changes it will be necessary to alter the time of departure from this Office of the European and Colonial Mails, and the next Mails will accordingly be despatched at the undermentioned dates, respectively, viz. :--

- Mails for the Australian Colonies, New Zealand, and Tasmania on Saturday the 1st prox., at 10 o'clock a.m.
- Mails for the United Kingdom, Continent of Europe, India, &c., &c., on Thursday the 6th prox., at 10 o'clock a.m.

Registered Letters for transmission by the above Mails must be posted One hour before the time of closing, and late letters, if stamped with a late fee, will be received up to 12-30 p.m. of the respective mail days. Money Orders on the Australian Colonies and New Zealand will be issued up to 11 o'clock a.m. on Thursday the 30th instant, and on the United Kingdom up to 11 o'clock a.m. on Monday the 3rd proximo.

Due Notice will be given to the Public of the days fixed for the departure of future Mails.
