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NOTICE.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, 25th February, 1868.

HEREAS, under and by virtue of the Ordinance 4th and 5th Victoria, No. 21, the Island of Rottnest is constituted a Prison, and by a Proclamation duly issued under the Provisions of the 2nd Section of the said Ordinance, and dated the 20th day of October, 1855, rules and regulations were made and promulgated touching the landing of boats at the said Island; And whereas it is found difficult to guard against the surreptitious landing of evil disposed persons, in consequence of the unrestricted trespasses of persons on the adjacent rocks and islands, under the pretence of fishing or otherwise; And whereas such rocks and islands constitute part of the Waste Lands of the Crown, and it becomes necessary, as a precautionary measure for the preservation of property, and for the safe custody of the prisoners, to pushibit persons landing thereon; Notice is hereby given that from and after the date hereof, the laws respecting trespasses upon lands will be strictly enforced against all persons who shall trespass on the island called Direction Island, or on any other of the rocks or islands adjacent to the said Prison-island, Rottnest.
