PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

THEREAS the Population of the Island of Mauritius is now suffering from Fever and other infectious disorders highly dangerous to the health of Her Majesty's subjects, and it is necessary to enforce, for the time being, the performance of Quarantine by Vessels arriving thence within the l'orts of Western Australia; Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said Colony, do hereby, by virtue of the provisions of an Ordinance of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, passed in the Third year of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, No. 1, entitled "An Act to enforce and "regulate the performance of Quarantine "in certain cases in Western Australia," NOTIFY AND PROCLAIM that the said Island of Mauritius is a place beyond the seas infected with such infectious disorders and diseases as aforesaid, and that it is probable that such disorders and diseases may be brought from such place to the said Colony; And I do hereby further notify and proclaim that immediately from and after this notification, all Ships and Vessels whatever arriving from and having touched at the said Island of Mauritius, shall be liable to the provisions of the said Ordinance.

Given under my hand ond the Public Seal of the said Colony, at Government House, Perth, this Second day of April, 1868.
