PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

IN pursuance of the Authority vested in me by an Ordinance passed in the Third year of the Reign of His Majesty King William the Fourth, No. 1, intituled "An Act to enforce and regulate the performance of Quarantine in certain cases "in Western Australia,"—I do hereby, with the advice of the Executive Council, notify, proclaim, and order that all Persons, Vessels, and Boats are hereby prohibited from going, under any pretence whatever, within the following limits of the Station which has been assigned by my Order, with the advice aforesaid, for the performance of Quarantine by the "Rio," found to have an infectious disease on board.

QUARANTINE LIMITS.

Within One mile Eastward of Garden Island, and to the North of a line between the summit of Garden Island and the summit of Brown Hill.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS the Population of the Island of Mauritius is now suffering from Fever and other infectious disorders highly dangerous to the health of Her Majesty's subjects, and it is necessary to enforce, for the time being, the performance of Quarantine by Vessels arriving thence within the Ports of Western Australia; Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said Colony, do hereby, by virtue of the provisions of an Ordinance, No. 1 of 1833, NOTIFY AND PROCLAIM the following Quarantine Order.

*Quarantine Order referred to.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the Ordinance 3rd William

4th No. 1. of 1833, doth hereby order that the "Rio," lately arrived at the Port of Fremantle from the Mauritius with the persons, goods, wares and merchandize, and other articles and things on board thereof, or belonging or appertaining thereto, at the time she so arrived at the Port of Fremantle aforesaid, do perform Quarantine during *Thirty-one* days from the 11th day of April instant, and until the same shall respectively performed, and shall be duly discharged from, Quarantine; and that such quarantine shall be performed at Garden Island within one mile eastward of Garden Island and to the north of a line between the summit of Garden Island and the summit of Brown Hill; and all persons so being on board thereof, shall not quit such vessel without the license of the Governor; nor shall any of such persons, goods, wares and merchandize, and other articles as aforesaid be removed therefrom during such period of quarantine. And the said Governor doth further Order that all such goods, wares, and merchandize, and other articles so ordered in quarantine shall be opened, aired, and fumigated.

CLACKLINE ROAD.

IT is hereby notified for general information that a public road, one chain wide, has recently been laid out and opened for traffic, between the Townsite of York and the Guildford-Northam road at Clackline Well, according to the following general description, a stout post having been fixed at each angle of the line.

Commencing on the western boundary of York Townsite, the road passes for about $39\frac{1}{2}$ chains between Avon locations Y 20 and Y 21, then west-north-westerly about 103 chains to north boundary of location Y 16, then N.N.W., N.W. and west 132 chains, and north-westerly 186 chains to south boundary of location *i* near the eastern foot of Boonaring Hill, then N.W. and N.N.W. $121\frac{1}{2}$ chains through said location to a spot 37 chains 90 links E N.E. from its west corner, then N.W. 152 chains and N $\frac{1}{2}$ W. $186\frac{1}{2}$ chains to south corner of location *e*, then generally N N.W. $157\frac{1}{2}$ chains along and partly within the west boundary of that location, and N.W $\frac{1}{2}$ N. $69\frac{1}{2}$ chains to south corner of location *e* 1, then N.W. 61 chains and W $\frac{1}{2}$ S. $53\frac{1}{2}$ chains to south corner of location 49, then generally west $90\frac{1}{2}$ chains, N.W. by N. 35 chains, W N.W. $48\frac{1}{4}$ chains, N.N.W. $22\frac{3}{4}$ chains, west $30\frac{3}{4}$ chains, and N.N.W. 36 chains to a spot near to and outside of the north corner of location 189, and then W. N.W. 70 chains to a post marked 40 on the Guildford-Northam road close to Clackline Well.—All bearings herein given being magnetic, and the measurements more or less.
