BUSSELTON-WARREN ROAD.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, 16th June, 1868.

T is hereby notified for general information, that a Public Road, one chain wide, has been laid out and opened for traffic, between the Townsite of Busselton and the Warren River Bridge just above Treen's Brook.

Commencing at the end of the causeway at S.E. corner of Busselton Townsite, the road will extend Easterly about a quarter of a mile, then generally S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 10 miles and E.S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. $11\frac{1}{2}$ miles, to the Bridge over Saint John's Brook, a little above Sussex location 28; then S $\frac{3}{4}$ E. 6 miles and S.S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ F. 6 miles to the lower and S.S.E. ½ E. 6 miles to the lower Blackwood Bridge midway between location 15 and the mouth of Nannup Brook. Thence it takes the general direction of S. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 9 miles and S. $\frac{3}{4}$ W. 9 miles to a bridge over Barlee Brook, then S. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. $3\frac{1}{4}$ miles to a bridge over a Gully, and S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. $3\frac{1}{4}$ miles to Beeribellup Ford over the main broads of Donelly Piver, which have main branch of Donelly River, which here runs to the S.W. The road then extends S. by E. 3 miles and South-easterly $3\frac{1}{4}$ miles to Caragodup Brook half a mile above its junction with Carey Brook. It then winds Easterly and Southerly for $2\frac{1}{4}$ miles to Beedelup Falls in Carey Brook, then to the Eastward and S.E. $3\frac{1}{4}$ miles to Fly Brook at the 37th mile mark from the lower Blackwood bridge, then S.E. 1 mile and E. by S. 3 miles to a bridge over Treen's Brook one mile above its junction with Warren River.—Four or five chains to the Southward of Treen's bridge the the road joins the Warren and Bunbury road, and then extends along said road half a mile S.W. by S. to the N.E. corner of Nelson location 46, and finally through that location about 35 chains in a Southwesterly direction to the bridge over Warren River, a little above the mouth of Treen's Brook. All bearings true or thereabouts, and measurements more or less.

Between the lower Blackwood Bridge and the Warren Bridge, the road is marked by numerous blazed Trees, and by marked Trees at every mile.
