BRIDGETOWN and WARREN ROAD.

*Colonial Secretary's Office,

IT is hereby notified for general information, that it is the intention of the Government, as soon as means may be available for the purpose, to survey and lay out a public road, one chain wide, between the Blackwood River bridge at Bridgetown and the Warren River bridge just above Treen's Brook.

Commencing at a spot on the south boundary of the Townsite of Bridgetown bearing nearly south from the Blackwood River bridge in Bridgetown, the road will pass in a southerly direction to the westward of Nelson locations 44 and 63, and then south-easterly about $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles along the present made road to a bridge over Forrest Brook, ascending then its eastern bank, and extending for about 10 miles in a direction generally SSE and South to the western side of locations 17 and 62 at Wilgarrup. The road will then diverge for about $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles to the SSW, to the SE corner of location 31 at Manjimup, after throwing off a short branch to location 32 at Ballarup, where is stationed the present District Post Office. From Manjimup it will take a general SW by S and S by W direction for 9 and 7 miles to location 73, passing through and beyond which in a general SSW direction for $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles, it will then join the road from Busselton to the Warren River bridge 4 or 5 miles southward from Treen's bridge which crosses a brook of the same name. Thence the road follows the route to the Warren bridge described in a Gazette notice dated 16th June, 1868. All bearings true.

More full particulars will be published in a future notice after the road shall have been surveyed and laid out. The public are in the meantime cautioned against

fencing across or otherwise obstructing the road in use.
