HEREAS His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, has vacated the Administration of the Government of the said Colony of Western Australia, for the express purpose of immediately departing and being absent therefrom, and the said Government has, in pursuance of Her Most Gracious Majesty's Letters Patent and the Royal Instructions therein referred to, devolved upon me, the Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Most Gracious Majesty's Land Forces, and the Executive Counsellor of the said Colony, whose name is first placed in the said Royal Instructions; and whereas I have this day taken the several oaths prescribed in that behalf by the said Royal Instructions before Her Majesty's Executive Council of the said Colony; Now THEREFORE I do hereby proclaim and make known that I have accordingly taken upon myself the Administration of the Government of the said Colony of Western Australia.

HEREAS, by the Colonial Passenger's Amendment Ordinance of 1868, it is enacted, that from the first day of January, 1869, every Colonial Vessel shall be commanded by a Master possessing a Certificate from the Board of Trade, or in the absence of such, a Certificate from a local Board to be named by The Governor, it is hereby notified for the information of persons desirous of obtaining certificates of competency as Masters, that His Excellency The Governor will appoint a Board of Officers to examine such persons at Fremantle during the month of December now next ensuing, and at such other times as may appear necessary.

General seamanship.

Vessels going eastward of King George's Sound, or northward of Shark's Bay will be required to carry a Chronometer and applicants must be capable of finding longitude by it.

Every Vessel must carry a Barometer.

The Board of Examiners will deliver to every applicant who passes a sati-factory Examination, and has given satisfactory evidence of his sobiety, experience, and ability, a Certificate of Competency, as Master; and any Master proceeding to sea in such capacity, without having obtained such certificate, will, after the first day of January next, incur a penalty not exceeding Fifty Pounds.
