PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Bruce, Esquire, Lieutenant Colonel in Her Majesty's Army, Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in Western Australia, Administering the Government in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS the undermentioned Ordinances were passed by His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, then Governor of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, in the Thirty-second Year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and intitled:—

- No. 1.—“An Ordinance to amend an Ordinance to declare the Law and Practice in cases of Escheat.”
3rd August, 1868.
- No. 3.—“An Ordinance for securing to Prosper Vincent Ramel, for a limited period, the exclusive benefit of a certain Invention.”
3rd August, 1868.
- No. 4.—“An Ordinance for securing to Samuel Golay, for a limited period, the exclusive benefit of a certain Invention.”
3rd August, 1868.
- No. 5.—“An Ordinance to enable the Trustees of the Town of Fremantle to assess the Inhabitants by a rental value.”
3rd August, 1868.
- No. 6.—“An Ordinance for Licensing Carriages in the Town of Fremantle.”
3rd August, 1868.
- No. 7.—“An Ordinance to vest in Her Majesty a certain piece of ground forming a portion of a Public thoroughfare known by the name

of Spencer Street, in the Town of Albany.”

3rd August, 1868.

- No. 9.—“An Ordinance to make better provision for the suppression of violent crimes committed by Convicts.”

3rd August, 1868.

- No. 10.—“An Ordinance for the better security of the Crown and Government.”

5th August, 1868.

- No. 11.—“An Ordinance to Supplement the Governor's Salary.”

7th August, 1868.

- No. 13.—“An Ordinance to confirm the expenditure for the services of the year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty seven, beyond the grant for that year.”

7th August, 1868.

- No. 15.—“An Ordinance to appropriate the sum of Ninety-six Thousand, Two Hundred and Seventy-six Pounds out of the General Revenue of the Colony, for the service of the year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty-nine.”

11th August, 1868.

NOW THEREFORE I, the said John Bruce, do hereby proclaim and make known unto all whom it may concern, that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the same.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Bruce, Esquire, Lieutenant Colonel in Her Majesty's Army, Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces, in Western Australia, Administering the Government in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS it is expedient to regulate the mooring and anchorage and moving of Ships within the limits of Princess Royal Harbour, in King George's Sound, in the said Colony, and also to appoint a Scale of Fees payable to the Harbour Master at Albany, King George's Sound aforesaid, with reference thereto: NOW THEREFORE I, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said Colony, do hereby by virtue of the "Ordinance to consolidate and amend the Laws for the Regulation of Shipping and of Pilotage and other Dues in the Harbours of Western Australia," passed in the 18th year of Her Majesty's Reign, No. 15, *Notify and proclaim* as follows:—

1. The Harbour Master for the Port of Albany shall be entitled to demand and receive, from every ship or vessel (not being *bonâ fide* engaged in the coasting trade of the said Colony) which shall arrive at and anchor or be moored in Princess Royal Harbour aforesaid, when and as such ship or vessel shall be moved from one place of moorage or anchorage to another in Princess Royal Harbour, the several fees or dues appointed by the third part of Schedule A, in the said recited Ordinance.

2. No Master or Commander of any such ship or vessel, which shall have once been moored or cast anchor in Princess Royal Harbour aforesaid, shall move such ship or vessel from one place of moorage or anchorage to another there, unless such ship or vessel shall be in actual charge and control of the Harbour Master of Albany or of a duly licensed Pilot.
