I transmit to you herewith, for your information and guidance, the Scheme of

Route proposed to be taken by Captain His Royal Highness The Duke of Edinburgh in Her Majesty's Ship "Galatea," showing the approximate times of his arrival at and departure from the several places he is to visit.

It is the desire of Her Majesty that there shall be no repetition of ceremonies at the reception of His Royal Highness in the Colonies which he has previously visited, so that Her Majesty's subjects, under these circumstances, may not have to incur any further expense.

1.—That the Reward be not payable until 5000 ounces of Gold, of standard purity at the least, and either alluvial or crushed from quartz, and obtained from such Gold Field, be entered and cleared at the Custom House in Fremantle, and actually shipped to Great Britain, either in one entry or by several entries, before the first day of July, 1870.
