PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Bruce, Esquire, Lieutenant Colonel in Her Majesty's Army, Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in Western Australia, and Senior Member of the Executive Council Administering the Government of the said Colony and its Dependencies.

WHEREAS by my Proclamation dated at Government House the 1st December, 1868, I the said Senior Member administering the Government of Western Australia, did notify and proclaim that the Island of Mauritius was then suffering from Fever and other infectious disorders highly dangerous to the health of Her Majesty's subjects, and that all ships and vessels arriving from and having touched at the said Island should be liable to the provisions of "The Quarantine Ordinance, 1868, and whereas the said Island, it is said, is now free from such disorders; NOW THEREFORE I, the said Senior Member of the Executive Council Administering the Government, do hereby notify that the said recited Proclamation is hereby repealed.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Bruce, Esquire, Lieutenant Colonel in Her Majesty's Army, Senior Military Officer in command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in Western Australia, Administering the Government in and over the Territory

of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS the undermentioned Ordinances were passed by His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esqr., then Governor of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, in the Thirty Second Year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and respectively intituled:—

No. 2.—"An Ordinance to amend the Laws relating to Trespasses by Live Stock."

3rd August, 1868.

No. 12.—"An Ordinance to repeal the Laws relating to Quarantine, and to make other provisions in lieu thereof."

7th August, 1868.

No. 14.—"An Ordinance to amend the Colonial Passengers' Ordinance, 1861."

11th August, 1868.

Now therefore I, the said John Bruce, do hereby proclaim and make known unto all whom it may concern that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the same.

£5000 REWARD!!
