NOTICE TO MARINERS.

Changes in Cape Recife Light to warn Ships of two near an approach to the Roman Rock in Algoa Bay.

ON and after the 1st December, 1868, a ray of Red Light will be shown from the Cape Recife Lighthouse, between a N. 39. E. bearing and the shore northwards from the Lighthouse.

Bearings are Magnetic.

DIRECTIONS.

Vessels bound for Algoa Bay, after passing Cape Recife, should not open the Red Light at the Cape until the Harbour Light upon the Hill is seen (which will first show red on a N. W. bearing, and lead nine tenths of a mile eastward of the Roman, where a course for the anchorage may be shaped with safety). As the Hill Light cannot be seen from the Roman Rock, a Ship is in safety so long as the Light can be seen; but as its southern extreme of visibility leads only two cables north of the Rock, it is recommended that a course for

the anchorage should not be shaped until the region of the Red Light is passed and the Hill Light shows Whiteon a N.W. by W. bearing

In beating in or out of the anchorage, the opening of the Red Light at either of the Lighthouses will be a signal for Vessels to tack when near the vicinity of the Roman Rock.

IRWIN ROAD EASTWARD FROM DENISON.

*Colonial Secretary's Office,
Perth, 21st May, 1869.*

IT is hereby notified for general information that a Public Road has been laid out and opened for traffic from Denison Townsite to the lower fords through the River Irwin, and thence upwards in a general Easterly direction.

Commencing at the junction of John Street with Dongara Road in Denison Townsite, the road will be one chain wide on the Western side of lines extending North 39 degrees 46 minutes East 22 chains 87 links, then North 54 degrees 27 minutes 14 chains 81 links, then North 33 degrees 23 minutes East 25 $\frac{1}{2}$ chains, then on the East side of lines extending North 36 $\frac{1}{2}$ degrees East 3 chains 58 links, then North 17 $\frac{1}{2}$ degrees East 5 chains, then North 9 degrees 40 minutes East 4 chains 33 links, then North 25 degrees 52 minutes East 4 chains 98 links, then North 3 degrees West 9 chains 63 links across the River Irwin, and then North 15 degrees 33 minutes East 23 chains 60 links through the S.W. corner of Location 88 to the Irwin Road.
