*By His Excellency John Bruce, Esquire,
Lieutenant Colonel in Her Majesty's
Army, Senior Military Officer in com-
mand of Her Majesty's Land Forces
in Western Australia, and Senior
Member of the Executive Council
Administering the Government of the
said Colony and its Dependencies.*

WHEREAS the undermentioned Or-
dinance was passed by His Ex-
cellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire,
then Governor of the said Colony, with
the advice and consent of the Legislative
Council thereof, in the Thirty-second Year
of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen
Victoria, and intituled:—

No. 8.—“An Ordinance further to provide
“summary remedy between Mas-
“ters and Servants.” 3rd August,
1868.

NOW THEREFORE I, the said JOHN
BRUCE, do hereby proclaim and make
known unto all whom it may concern, that
Her Majesty has been graciously pleased
to confirm and allow the same.

IRWIN ROAD EASTWARD FROM DENISON.

*Colonial Secretary's Office,
Perth, 21st May, 1869.*

IT is hereby notified for general information that a Public Road has been laid out and opened for traffic from Denison Townsite to the lower fords through the River Irwin, and thence upwards in a general Easterly direction.

Commencing at the junction of John Street with Dongara Road in Denison Townsite, the road will be one chain wide on the Western side of lines extending North 39 degrees 46 minutes East 22 chains 87 links, then North 54 degrees 27 minutes 14 chains 81 links, then North 33 degrees 23 minutes East 25½ chains, then on the East side of lines extending North 3¼ degrees East 3 chains 88 links, then North 17½ degrees East 5 chains, then North 9 degrees 40 minutes East 4 chains 38 links, then North 25 degrees 52 minutes East 4 chains 98 links, then North 3 degrees West 9 chains 63 links across the River Irwin, and then North 15 degrees 33 minutes East 23 chains 60 links through the S.W. corner of Location 88 to the Irwin Road. It will then be half a chain wide on South side of a line extending South 87 degrees West 20 chains 55 links to a spot on the Road towards Geraldton.
