£5000 REWARD!!

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, Western Australia, 15th July, 1869.

T is hereby notified for general information, that the Local Government of Western Australia offer as a Reward for the discovery of a workable Gold Field within a radius of Three hundred miles from any declared port in the Colony, on or before the 31st day of December, 1869, the sum of

£5000

upon the following conditions:-

1.—That the Reward be not payable until 5000 ounces of Gold, of standard purity at the least, and either alluvial or crushed from quartz, and obtained from such Gold Field, be entered and cleared at the Custom House in Fremantle, and actually shipped to Great Britain, either in one entry or by several entries, before the first day of July, 1870.

2.—That the Governor of the Colony for the time being, in Executive Council do finally adjudicate and determine to whom alone, or, if there be several claimants, to whom and in what proportions, and under what circumstances, such Reward shall be payable and paid.

3.—That the locality or localities of such discovery be clearly and accurately defined and published in the Government Gazette of the said Colony of Western Australia on or before the 31st day of December, 1869.

CONVEYANCE OF ALBANY MAIL.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, 17th August, 1869.

"ENDERS (in duplicate) endorsed "Tenders for Albany Mail," will be received at this Office until noon of Wednesday, the 24th November, 1869, for the conveyance of Colonial and Foreign mails from Perth to Albany and vice versa, twice a month for three years, commencing on the 1st January, 1870.

The contractor will be required to convey the mails at such dates in each month as the Postmaster General shall fix.

Parties tendering must state the time in which they will undertake to convey the mails from Perth to Albany and vice versa.

The tender stipulating to convey the mails in the shortest time will be preferably considered.

In case the contractor should fail to deliver the mails at either Perth or Albany within his contract time, in consequence of the overloading of the mail cart with passengers or luggage, &c., he will be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20—exclusive of any sum recoverable by his bond.

In the event of the mail packet discontinuing to touch at King George's Sound during the period of the contract, the unexpired portion of it will be cancelled.

The arrival and departure of mails will be subject to instructions from the Postmaster General, and liable to alteration at any time during the contract.

The contractor will be required to provide an officer of the Post Office with a free passage to and from Albany, if called upon to do so at any time by the Postmaster General.

Two approved sureties will be required

to join the contractor in a guarantee for the due fulfilment of the contract.

No payment will be made on account of the contract until a bond shall have been signed by the contractor and his sureties, and any breach of contract will subject the contractor to the loss of a proportionate part of his monthly pay, or the cancellation of his contract.

The contractor will be required to convey and deliver all mails which may be entrusted to him under the authority of the Postmaster General, and to provide secure and water-tight lockers for the mails, and coverings for the same. He will, moreover, be bound not to convey, or permit his servants to convey any letter or packet to the prejudice of the Post Office Revenue, under a penalty of £3 for every offence, which penalty will be deducted from his monthly pay.

The persons employed by the contractor to convey the mails are to be subject to the approval of the Postmaster General both as to age and character.

Further particulars may be obtained on reference to the Postmaster General, at whose office forms of tender may be obtained, as well as from the Resident Magistrates of the various districts.
