WHEREAS the undermentioned Ordinances were passed by His Excellency JOHN BRUCE, Esquire, Senior Member of the Executive Council then Administering the Government of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, in the Thirty-third year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and respectively intituled:—

No 11.—“An Ordinance to confirm the expenditure for the services of the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight beyond the grant for that year”

12th July, 1869.

No. 12.—“An Ordinance to appropriate the sum of one hundred and one thousand two hundred and ninety-four pounds out of the General Revenue of the Colony for the services of the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy.”

12th July, 1869.

NOW THEREFORE I, the said FREDERICK ALOYSIUS WELD, do hereby proclaim and make known unto all whom it may concern that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the same.

£5000 REWARD!!
