SECTION 79.

"No paid Officer under the Govern-"ment of a Colony can be permitted " to be the Editor of a newspaper or to "take any active part in the manage-"ment of it. He may furnish arti-"cles signed with his name upon "subjects of general interest, ab-"staining from writing on questions "which can properly be called poli-"tical, or discussing the measures of "the Government or the official pro-"ceedings of its officers and from "furnishing any articles whatever to "a newspaper which in commenting " on the measures of the Government "should habitually exceed the bounds "of fair and temperate discussion. "If the authorship of anonymous "articles should be brought home to "any officer, or if in articles bearing

"his signature he should discuss "any political subject, or the mea"sures of the Government or the
"official procedings of its officers, he
"will be liable to be removed from
"office."
