General Post Office, Perth, 7th June, 1870.

T is hereby notified for general information that on and formation that on and after the 1st July next, the postage on all Newspapers posted in this Colony for places within and beyond the limits of the Colony will be abolished, except in the case of papers for the United Kingdom forwarded viâ Marseilles and via Brindisi, and of those for British Colonies and Foreign Countries forwarded through the United Kingdom.

The postage in these cases will be as

United Kingdom, viá Marseilles, 2d. each.

United Kingdom, viâ Brindisi, 2d. each, and 1d. for every 4 ounces, or fraction of 4 ounces, in weight.

British Colonies and Foreign Countries, viâ the United Kingdom, 1d. less than the rates given in Table A of the "Rates of Postage" published on the 1st January last.
