Road between York and Cowring Well.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, 21st June, 1870.

T is hereby notified for general information that a public road, one chain wide, has recently been laid out and opened for traffic between the Mackie River Road, near right bank of the Avon, and Cowring Well.

Commencing at a part of the South boundary of Avon location D where it is crossed by the public road from York about 177 chains South South East from the lower bridge over Mackie River, the road extends East North East for about 336 chains along the North side of the said South boundary of location D to a spot near its East corner, then about 386 chains East, 9 degrees South through the South corner of Avon location No. 476 to the South corner of location 477, and thence about 141 chains East, 20 degrees South to Cowring Well, which is within a reserve of one hundred acres of land for the use of travellers. Notice to Postmasters and the Public.

General Post Office, Perth, 7th June, 1870.

T is hereby notified for general information that on and after the 1st July next, the postage on all Newspapers posted in this Colony for places within and beyond the limits of the Colony will be abolished, except in the case of papers for the United Kingdom forwarded viâ Marseilles and viâ Brindisi, and of those for British Colonies and Foreign Countries forwarded through the United Kingdom.

The postage in these cases will be as follows:—

United Kingdom, viâ Marseilles, 2d. each.

United Kingdom, viâ Brindisi, 2d. each, and 1d. for every 4 ounces, or fraction of 4 ounces, in weight.

British Colonies and Foreign Countries, viâ the United Kingdom, 1d. less than the rates given in Table A of the "Rates of Postage" published on the 1st January last.
