## IRWIN ROAD EASTWARD FROM DENISON.

IT is hereby notified for general information, that a Public Road has been laid out and opened for traffic from Denison Townsite to the lower fords through the River Irwin, and thence upwards in a general Easterly direction.

Commencing at the junction of John Street on Denison Townsite with Dongara Road, the road will be one chain wide on the Western side of lines extending as follows:—
