WESTERN AUSTRALIA, PROCLAMATION by His-Excellency FREDERICK ALOYSIUS WELD, Esquire, Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS it is enacted by the second section of the "Small Debts Ordinance, 1863," that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, and at any time by Proclamation published in the Western Australian Government Gazette, to constitute Local Courts for the recovery of Small Debts and Demands, to be holden at such times and places, and within such Districts throughout the said Colony as may be most fit and convenient, and as may be specified in such Proclamation; and likewise by Proclamation to alter the time, or place, or manner of holding any such Courts; and that it has been deemed expedient to alter, as hereinafter specified, the time for holding the Local Court at Geraldton;

Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in exercise of such power, do hereby notify and proclaim, that from and after this date the Local Court at Geraldton shall be holden on the second Tuesday in each month.

> Given under my Hand and the Public Seal of the said Colony, at Government House, Perth, this seventeenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, and in the thirty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.
