WESTERN AUSTRALIA, PROCLAMATION by His to wit. Excellency FREDERICK ALOYSIUS WELD, Esquire, Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS, by an Ordinance passed in the 9th year of the reign of Her present Majesty, No. 6, intituled "An Ordinance to provide for the Conveyance and Postage of Letters," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor to fix the rates and sums of money to be demanded by the Postmaster-General and Postmasters respectively, and their Assistants, for the receiving, despatching, and delivering of Letters, Newspapers, and Packets, and to increase and reduce the same from time to time as to the said Governor shall seem meet; And whereas it is desirable to alter the rates of postage chargeable on letters to be sent to the Australian Colonies, inclusive of Tasmania and New Zealand:

Now therefore, in exercise of the said recited power and authority, I, Frederick Aloysius Weld, Esquire, the Governor of the Colony of Western Australia, do hereby reduce the present rates of postage fixed to be paid within the Colony for the transmission of such letters, and do Proclaim and declare that the postage payable within the Colony on Letters for the said Colonies shall be according to the Schedule hereunder written, and that such Postage shall in all cases be paid at the time such letters are delivered into the Post in Western Australia. And I do truly declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the third day of September, 1870.
