HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct the publication of the following Regulations, issued by Her Majesty's Government for the guidance of British Pilots, in regard to piloting French or Prussian Ships of War.

### INSTRUCTIONS TO BRITISH PILOTS.

"British Pilots are not to pilot Ships of War of either belligerent, except in British Waters, within three miles of the shore, or to do more than pilot such ships into or out of British Ports or Roadsteads when they are not at the time engaged in any hostile operations: but Ships of War in distress may always be piloted out of immediate danger."

TENDERS (in duplicate) endorsed "Tenders for the Conveyance of the ——— Mail" (as the case may be) will be received at this Office until noon of Wednesday, the 16th November next, for the conveyance of the following Mails for one, two, or three years, commencing on the 1st January, 1871:—

1. Perth to Fremantle, and *vice versa*, twice daily (Sundays excepted.)

2. Perth to Guildford, and *vice versa*, daily (Sundays excepted.)
3. Guildford to Newcastle, and *vice versa*, twice a week.
4. Guildford to York, and *vice versa*, twice a week.
5. Perth to Vasse, *via* Canning, Serpentine, Pinjarrah, Australind, and Bunbury, and *vice versa*, twice a week.
6. York to Newcastle, *via* Northam, and *vice versa*, twice a week.
7. York to Stanton's Springs, *via* Brookton and Beverley, and *vice versa*, once a week.
8. Guildford to Upper Swan, and *vice versa*, once a week.
9. Pinjarrah to Mandurah, and *vice versa*, once a week.
10. Bunbury to Blackwood, and *vice versa*, twice a month.
11. Busselton to Quindalup, and *vice versa*, twice a week.

Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5, are required to be conveyed in spring vehicles, and in the other cases tenderers are to state whether they propose to convey the Mails in a spring cart or on horseback, as preference will probably be given to the former mode of conveyance, where offered.

The Government do not bind themselves to accept the lowest or any tender, and will require the guarantee of two responsible persons for the due performance of the Contract.

*Special Forms of Tender*, with conditions attached, may be had on application to the Postmaster-General and the various Resident Magistrates, and no tenders will be entertained unless rendered on these forms.
