Road Irwin River towards Geraldton.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that a Public Road has been laid out and opened for traffic, between the crossing of Irwin River, at Dongarra, and the North-west end of Company Road at Bootenal.

9.—VIGORS ROAD.

Fifty-five chains in length, and 50 links wide, extends true South West from the east corner of Victoria location 98, on Gregory Road, to the west corner of location 120, on Company Road, the limits being marked by squared posts.

10.—PHILLIPS AND GEORGINA ROADS.

Phillips Road, one chain wide, extends true S.W. from Crowther Road, at the west corner of Victoria location 229, indefinitely towards the sea coast, then true N.E. 30 chains to Company Road.

One chain in width, New Road extends true S.W. indefinitely towards the sea coast, from the west corner of Victoria location 91, on Company Road, and from said corner true N.E. 116 chains to Hampton Road, crossing Gregory Road, and being marked by squared posts at all intersections.

12.—HAMERSLEY AND MACARTNEY ROADS.

From the east corner of Victoria location 76, on Company Road, Hamersley Road, one chain wide, extends true South West indefinitely towards the sea coast, then from said corner true N.E. 55 chains to Gregory Road, 60 chains farther to Hampton Road, at S.W. end of Macartney Road; then about 77 chains 50 links farther to Phelps Road, 70 chains farther to east end of Kennedy Road, 161 chains farther to Arthur Road, and 50 chains farther to N.E. end of Macartney Road; all measurements being more or less, and the intersections with other roads being marked by squared posts.

13.—SMALL ROAD.

14.—PHELPS ROAD.

Commencing at an angle in the southern boundary of Victoria location 441, where Evans Road joins the north end of Junction Road, Phelps Road, one chain wide, extends true N.W. about 97 chains 50 links to Macartney Road, then 156 chains 85 links farther to Georgina Road, then 159 chains 35 links farther to Bootenal Road, and then true N.W. indefinitely; the measurements being more or less, and squared posts at the intersection of roads.

15.—KENNEDY ROAD.

Commencing on the N.W. side of Macartney Road, where it is joined by Short Road, Kennedy Road is one chain wide, extending true N.W. 156 chains 85 links to Georgina Road, then 159 chains 35 links farther N.W. to Bootenal Road, and then true N.W. indefinitely; the measurements being more or less, and squared posts at the intersection of roads.

16.—EDWARD ROAD.

Edward Road is one chain wide on the N.E. side of lines extending true N.W. about 158 chains 35 links to Bootenal Road, and then true N.W. indefinitely; squared posts being placed at the intersection of roads.

17.—ARTHUR ROAD.

Commencing at a part of the N.W. side of Macartney Road, situate 161 chains N.E. from Kennedy Road, Arthur Road extends one chain wide true N.W. 156 chains 85 links to Georgina Road, then 159 chains 35 links farther to Bootenal Road, and then true N.W. indefinitely; the measurements being more or less, and squared posts at the intersection of cross roads.

18.—NABBEJA ROAD.

Nabbeja Road, one chain wide, is on the N.E. side of lines extending South 36 deg. 45 min. East, about 208 chains from the east side of Macartney Road, opposite to the south end of Arthur Road, then about 261 chains true S.E. and 41 chains 50 links true S.W., to a spot on the N.E. side of Greenough Road, 40 chains N.W. from the west corner of Victoria location 439; all bearings being true or thereabouts, and the measurements more or less.

19.—SHORT ROAD.

From the S.E. side of Macartney Road, opposite to the S.E. end of Kennedy Road, Short Road extends true East 198 chains 62 links, one chain wide, to Nabbeja Road, and is marked by squared posts.

20.—EVANS ROAD.

Commencing at the S.E. end of Phelps Road, Evans Road, one chain wide, extends true East 284 chains 40 links to Nabbeja Road, and is marked by squared posts at the crossing of other roads; the measurements more or less.

21.—GREENOUGH ROAD.

Commencing from the N.E. side of Walk-away Road, at the east end of Gregory Road, Greenough Road is one chain wide on the south side of lines extending true N.E. 50 chains, then true East about 311 chains, and true S.E. about 7 chains, 50 links to south end of Nabbeja Road. It is posted at the intersection of cross roads, and from the South end of Nabbeja Road extends about five and a-half miles in a South Easterly direction to Wondada Spring, near Mount Hill.

22.—WALTER ROAD.

From Nabbeja Road, at the east end of Short Road, Walter Road extends true South about 259 chains, and one chain wide, to Greenough Road, and is marked by squared posts at the intersection of cross roads.

23.—PADBURY ROAD.

Padbury Road extends true South about 203 chains, and one chain wide, to Greenough River, from the N.E. corner of Victoria location 424 on Short Road, and is posted at the angles of cross roads.

24.—JUNCTION ROAD.

From a spot on the north edge of Gregory Road, about 5 chains from the South corner of Victoria location 197, Junction Road, one chain wide, extends about 41 chains in an irregular northerly direction to that location's north corner, then about 25 chains North a little westerly to the S.E. end of Hampton Road, then about North by West 41 chains, and about North by East 40 chains, and about N.W. by North 20 chains, to the S.E. end of Phelps Road; the angles of the road being marked by squared posts.
