IS Excellency The Governor has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations to be observed in the management of the Receiving Store connected with the Customs House at Fremantle, commonly known as "A Store."

- 1. The Building to be under the Control and Supervision of the Customs Department.
- 2. It will be open each day from 7 a.m. to 8 a.m., and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. daily, except Saturdays, when it will be closed at noon.
- 3. No Timber, Coals, Gun Powder, Kerosene, Bricks, Iron, Stone, Tar, Hay (except hay the property of the Government), nor any other material or substance that in the opinion of the Collector of Customs for the time being may be considered of a dangerous nature, or likely to damage either the Store or the Goods in it, shall be stowed therein.
- 4. All Goods to be stowed in such places as may be pointed out by the Officer in Charge of the "Receiving Store," at the risk and expense of the depositor, and no goods removed without his sanction.
- 5. All Goods approved by the Collector of Customs, with the exceptions named in Rule No. 3, may be deposited

in "A Store," at the following rates of charges:—

- 6. All Goods after 3 months' deposit may, at the discretion of the Collector of Customs, be advertised for two clear weeks, and if not claimed and cleared, may be submitted to Public Auction; and from the sum realised it shall be lawful for the Collector of Customs to carry to the credit of the Government the full rent and any charges due, and hand over the balance to the owner or his agent, if claimed within 12 months from date of sale.
- 7. Smoking and the use of lucifer matches strictly prohibited inside the building.

THE following By-Laws for regulating the proceedings of the Fremantle Municipal Council, have been confirmed by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of his Executive Council.

RESOLVED—That in accordance with the 28th Section of "The Municipal Institutions' Act, 1871," the following By-Laws be now adopted by the Council of the Fremantle Municipality, for the regulation, management, and control of the several matters and things therein set forth, viz.:-

- The Council shall meet for the transaction of business in the Odd Fellows' Hall, Fremantle, or such other place as the Council may hereafter fix, on the first Wednesday in every month, or oftener if necessary.
- 2. The Supervisor for the time being shall have the immediate custody, care, management, and direction, under instructions from the Council, of all Buildings, Lands, Streets, Paths, Jetties, Wharves, Trees, Paths, Posts, Fences, Works, Drains, Culverts, and other property belonging to or in charge of the Council, and shall be answerable for the preservation and due care of the same.
- The Collector for the time being, appointed by the Council, shall have the necessary legal power and authority to demand and collect all Rates, Assessments, License fees, Fines, Forfeitures, Tolls, and other sums due to the Council, and his receipt shall be a full and sufficient discharge for the same. And all sums so collected shall be lodged with the Treasurer and by him paid into the Bank to the credit of the Council at least once a week, under a penalty of any sum not exceeding £20.
- 4. Any person who shall keep or use a Carriage, Car, Cart, Waggon, or other Vehicle within the boundaries of the Municipality for seven days, without having obtained a License, to be signed by the Chairman of the Council, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £10.
- Any person who shall keep or use any vehicle in the course of trade or for hire, within the boundaries of the Municipality, without having the owner's name and the licensed number painted thereon, in letters not less than one inch in length, in some conspicuous place on the off side of such vehicle, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £2.

6. Any person who shall keep for 7 days, within the boundaries of the Municipality, and depasture the same on Town or Crown Lands, any cattle, sheep, or goats, without having obtained a License signed by the Chairman of the Council, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £1.

7. Any person who shall keep for 7 days within the boundaries of the Municipality a Dog above the age of six weeks, without having obtained a License signed by the Chairman, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not less than £1 nor exceeding £5.

- All Licenses issued by the Chairman of the Council shall continue in force until the 31st of December in each year, and no license shall be issued for a less period than 6 months.
- 9. Any person who shall (without first having obtained the written sanction of the Chairman of the Council) cut down, damage, destroy, or injure any Tree, Plant, Post, Fence, Gate, Drain, Water-course, Culvert, Jetty, Wharf, Building, or other property belonging to or in charge of the Council, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £10.
- 10. Any person who shall in the course of trade or business, within the boundaries of the Municipality, use any false weights and measures, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £10.
- 11. Any person who shall sell or offer for sale, within the boundaries of the Municipality, any Meat, Fish, or Vegetables, unfit for human food, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £10.
- 12. Any owner or occupier of any land, house, or premises, within the boundaries of the Municipality, who shall neglect or refuse for fourteen days after due notice from the Inspector of Nuisances or Chairman of the Council, to abate or remove all nuisances which are or shall arise thereon, or to remove any inflammable building, or pile or stack of wood, or other material dangerous to the adjoining or contiguous property, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £10.
- Any person after the thirty-first day of December next who shall keep or have more than five cords of Firewood within the boundaries of the Municipality, and shall not stack the same at least ten feet from any wall or building, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £10.
- 14, Any person who shall take away or remove from the sea or river beach any Šand or Sea Weed, or shall make any pit in the sand, or who shall put or place, or cause to be put or

placed, any Timber or other Goods, Chattels, or Materials on the beach, and keep the same on the beach for a longer period than seven days, without having first obtained the written permission of the Chairman of the Council, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £5.

15. All persons claiming to vote at any election for Chairman and Councillors shall first register their claims with the Clerk to the Council on or before the first day of November in each year, and the Council are hereby authorized to revise such claims at their next meeting after the said first day of November, and to expunge the names of all persons claiming to vote whose claims shall in their judgment be illegal. Any person whose name shall be so expunged from the Register of Electors and Ratepayers to have power to appeal to the Resident Magistrate against the decision of the Council, on first giving fourteen days' written notice to the Chairman of the Municipality: the decision of the Resident Magistrate to be final and conclusive on all parties, but no person so appealing shall vote at any election until the appeal be decided.

- 16. Any owner or occupier of any House, Shop, Store, or other building within the boundaries of the Municipality, whose roof shall overhang or project over any thoroughfare or footway without having a proper gutter and pipe to carry off the rain, or who shall construct or have any Cornice, Crane, Hoist, or any other fixture or projection overhanging or upon any footway or thoroughfare, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £5 for every month such nuisance shall continue and remain, after fourteen days' notice to remove the same shall have been given in writing by the Inspector of Nuisances or the Chairman of the Council.
- 17. That no Contractor for any work or material for the Municipality shall, after the first December next, be allowed to hold office as Chairman or Councillor.
