HIS Excellency The Governor in Council has been pleased to direct the publication of the following Regulations for the conduct and management of elections of District Boards of Education in the several Districts of the Colony.

1. Until such time as the Central Board of Education shall designate and define any locality to be an educational district, every Resident Magistrate's District in the Colony shall be an "Educational District."

2. The election of members of District Boards of Education shall be held at such times and places as The Governor in Council may direct.

3. Every person who shall have attained the age of twenty-one years, being a natural-born subject or a naturalised subject of Her Majesty, and who in no part of the British Dominions hath been convicted of any treason or felony, unless he shall have obtained a free pardon thereof, or has undergone the sentence passed on him for such offence, shall be qualified to serve as a member of any board under this Act.—(Sec. 13, 35 Vic., No. 14.)

4. Every District Board shall consist of five members.—(Sec. 9.)

5. No person shall be permitted to vote at any district election who does not habitually reside in such District.— (Sec. 9.)

6. All persons who have resided in the Colony for a period of at least six months and whose names are on the electoral roll for the election of members of the Legislative Council, subject always to the restriction in the next preceding rule, shall be entitled to vote at any district election.—(Sec. 10.)

7. In the event of an education rate or tax being hereafter imposed in the Colony, all persons paying such rate shall be entitled to vote in the district wherein such tax is paid; subject always to the restriction in Rule 5; and the names of such persons shall be inserted in an educational electoral roll for such district on the presentation to the Resident Magistrate of the district of a certificate from a Collector of Taxes, countersigned by a Justice of the Peace, setting forth the due payment of such rate or tax.— (Sec. 10.)

8. The parent of any child, who presents a certificate that such child has attended one hundred and ninety days in one year, then immediately preceding, at any school consisting of more than twelve pupils, such certificate to be signed by any manager or master of such schooland countersigned by a Justice of the Peace, shall be entitled to have his or her name inserted in an educational electoral roll, and to vote at the election of members of a District Board.—(Sec. 10.)

9. The Returning Officer of each District shall cause public notice to be given of the date fixed for the election of a district board so soon as may be practicable after the receipt of the writ for such election.

10. The Polling at every such election shall commence at noon on the day fixed, and the poll shall be closed at four o'clock on the same day.

11. Every voter shall be entitled to five votes, such being equal to the number of the members of a District Board. Not more than one vote can be given in favor of any one person.

12. Votes may be given personally, by voting papers, as at elections of Members of the Legislative Council, or by proxy. Voting papers for personal delivery, or proxy papers, may be had on application at the office of the Resident Magistrate in any district.

13. Voters should clearly understand that Members of a District Board of Education are elected for a period of three years. 14. The Resident Magistrate in each District shall make an additional electoral roll, to be called "The Educational Electoral Roll," and shall insert therein all the names of those persons who may under Section 10 of the "Elementary Education Act, 1871," be entitled to vote at an election of Members of a District Board of Education.

15. Such roll shall be retained by the Resident Magistrate of each district, shall be open to inspection at all reasonable hours, and shall be subject to revision in the same manner as the electoral lists for election of Members of the Legislative Council, as provided in Sections 9, 10, and 11 of the Ordinance 33rd Victoria, No. 13.

16. The Resident Magistrate in each District having charge of the Electoral Roll for the Election of Members of the Legislative Council, shall add a column to such roll, and in such column shall insert against the name of each elector on such roll the words "resident" or "non-resident," as the case may be.

17. Nothing in these Regulations shall prevent any female duly qualified under Section 13 of "The Elementary Education Act, 1871," from being elected or from serving as a member of a District Board of Education.

THE following By-laws, for regulating the proceedings of the Geraldton Municipal Council, have been confirmed by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of his Executive Council.

RESOLVED—That in accordance with the 28th Section of "The Municipal Institutions' Act, 1871," the following By-laws be now adopted by the Council of the Geraldton Municipality, for the regulation, management, and control of the several matters and things therein set forth, viz.

1. The Council shall meet, for the transaction[®] of business, in the Geraldton Hotel, Geraldton, or such other place as the Council may hereafter fix, on the first Monday in every month, or oftener if necessary.

2. The Supervisor for the time being shall have the immediate custody, care, management, and direction, under the direction of the Chairman of the Town Council, of all Buildings, Lands, Streets, Paths, Jetties, Wharves, Trees, Posts, Fences, Works, Drains, Culverts, and other property belonging to or in charge of the Council, and shall be answerable for the preservation and due care of the same.

3. The Collector for the time being, appointed by the Council, shall have the necessary legal power and authority to demand and collect all Rates, Assessments, License fees, Fines, Forfeitures, Tolls, and other sums due to the Council, and his receipt shall be full and sufficient discharge for the same. And all sums so collected shall be lodged with the Treasurer once a week, and by him paid into the Western Australian Bank at least once a month, under a penalty of any sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

4. Any person residing within the boundaries of the Municipality of Geraldton, who shall keep or use a Carriage, Car, Cart, Waggon, or other Vehicle, for seven days, without having obtained a License, to be signed by the Chairman of the Council, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

5. Any person who shall keep or use any vehicle in the course of trade or for hire, within the boundaries of the Municipality, without having the owner's name and the licensed number painted thereon, in letters not less than one inch in length, in some conspicuous place on the off side of such vehicle, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding Two pounds.

6. Any person who shall keep for 7 days, within the boundaries of the Municipality, and depasture the same on Town or Crown Lands, any cattle, horses, sheep, or goats, without having obtained a License signed by the Chairman of the Council, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £1.

7. Any person who shall keep for seven days within the boundaries of the Municipality a Dog, above the age of six months, without having obtained a License signed by the Chairman, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not less than One pound, nor exceeeding Five pounds.

8. All Licenses issued by the Chairman of the Council shall continue in force until the 31st of December in each year, and no license shall be issued for a less period than 6 months.

9. Any person who shall (without first having obtained the written sanction of the Chairman of the Council) cut down, damage, destroy, or injure any Tree, Plant, Post, Fence, Gate, Drain, Water-course, Culvert, Jetty, Wharf, Building, or other property belonging to or in charge of the Council, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £10.

10. Any person who shall in the course of trade or business, within the boundaries of the Municipality, use any false weights or measures, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £10.

11. Any person who shall sell or offer for sale, within the boundaries of the Municipality, any Meat, Fish, or Vegetables, unfit for human food, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £10.

12. Any person or occupier of any land, house, or premises, within the boundaries of the Municipality, who shall neglect or refuse for fourteen days after due notice from the Inspector of Nuisances, or Chairman of the Council, to abate or remove all nuisances which are or shall arise thereon, or to remove any inflammable building, or pile or stack of wood, or any material dangerous to the adjoining or contiguous property, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £10.

13. Any person who shall take away or remove from the sea or river beach any Sand or Sea Weed, or shall make any pit in the sand, or who shall put or place, or cause to be put or placed, any Timber or other Goods, Chattels, or Materials on the beach, and keep the same on the beach for a longer period than seven days, without having first obtained the written permission of the Chairman of the Council, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding $\pounds 5$. 14. Any persons claiming to vote at any election for Chairman and Councillors shall first register their claims with the Clerk to the Council on or before the first day of November in each year, and the Council are hereby authorized to revise such claims at their next meeting after the said first day of November, and to expunge the names of all persons claiming to vote whose claims shall in their judgment be illegal. Any person whose name shall be so expunged from the Register of Electors and Ratepayers to have power to appeal to the Resident Magistrate against the decision of the Council, on first giving fourteen days' written notice to the Chairman of the Municipality: the decision of the Resident Magistrate to be final and conclusive on all parties, but no person so appealing shall vote at any election until the appeal be decided.

15. Any person occupying a house and allowing a chimney in the aforesaid house to take fire, or any person burning rubbish, &c., within the boundaries of the Municipality, without consent of the Chairman, will be fined for every such offence any sum not less than One pound and not exceeding Five pounds.

That the present Jetty Regulations be adopted, and that the wharfage on either side of the Jetty be let, in blocks of feet, annually, by public auction.

Any person allowing any Stock of any 17. description to stray on the Sand Hills, or who shall remove therefrom any bush or growth whatever within the Municipality, without the consent of the Chairman in writing, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £1 or

That any Stock of any description found trespassing to the westward of Phelps Road and George Road, terminating by a west line at the two-mile well on the Mines Road, shall be liable to be impounded.

19. That all owners of Town Allotments shall be compelled, on notice from the Chairman of the Council, to erect a brick or stone wall, not less than four feet in height from the level of the road, on both sides of Marine Terrace, extending from Burges Street to Bayley Street; also Gregory Street south to Augustus Street, and Fitzgerald Street south to Sandford Street. The Stone and Lime required for building the same to be provided by the Town Council at the quarries. Any person building such wall with brick to be allowed out of the funds of the Municipality a sum equivalent to the cost of stone required, calculating the same at one shilling per yard.

Any person quarrying Stone on Crown Lands within the Municipality, without having obtained a license from the Chairman for the same, shall be fined any sum not exceeding £1.

- d.—A Bonus of One Hundred Pounds will be granted to the 3rd.—A person who first Exports a quantity exceeding Two hundred weight of Cocoons, bearing Silk of good quality, produced by him in the Colony within seven years from this date.
