THE following By-laws, for regulating the proceedings of the Bunbury Municipal Council, have been confirmed by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of his Executive Council.

FRED. P. BARLEE, Colonial Secretary.

Resolved—That in accordance with the 28th Section of "The Municipal Institutions' Act, 1871," the following By-laws be now adopted by the Bunbury Municipal Council, for the regulation, management, and control of the several matters and things therein set forth,

- 1. The Bunbury Municipal Council shall meet in the Mechanics' Hall, for the transaction of business, on the first Monday in every month, or oftener if necessary; each meeting to commence at 7 o'clock p.m.
- 2. The Supervisor (when such officer shall be appointed) shall have the immediate custody, care, management, and direction, under instructions from the Council, of all Buildings, Lands, Streets, Paths, and Jetties (when there shall be any Jetty under the jurisdiction of the Council), Trees, Plants, Posts, Fences, Works, Drains, Culverts, and other property belonging to or in charge of the Council, and shall be answerable for the preservation and due care of the same.
- The Collector for the time being, appointed by the Council, shall have the necessary legal power and authority to demand and collect all Rates, Assessments, License fees, Fines, Tolls, Forfeitures, and other sums due to the Council, and his receipt shall be a full and sufficient discharge for the same; the periods for collection of such dues to be fixed by the Council at the time this rate is declared. And all sums so collected shall be lodged in the Bank by the Collector, to the credit of the Treasurer, at least once a week (except when the amount in the Collectors' hand shall be under £5), under a penalty of any sum not exceeding Twenty shillings.
- 4. Any person who shall keep or use a Carriage, Car, Cart, Waggon, or other Vehicle on which any license is chargeable as set forth in the Schedule of Fees for vehicles, &c., within the boundaries of the Municipality, for seven days, without having obtained a License, to be signed by the Chairman of the Council, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding (£10) Ten pounds.

vehicle in the course of trade or for hire, within the boundaries of the Municipality, without having the owner's name and the licensed number painted thereon, in letters not less than one inch in length, in some conspicuous place on the off side of such vehicle, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

Any person who shall keep for 7 days, within the boundaries of the Town, and depasture the same on Town Lands, any cattle, sheep, or goats, without having obtained a License signed by the Chairman of the Council, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding Twenty shillings (£1.)

7. Any person who shall keep for seven days within the boundary of the Municipality a Dog above the age of six months, without having obtained a License signed by the Chairman, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not less than £1 and not more than £5.

SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR DOG LICENSES.

For every Dog above the age of 6 months 7s. 6d. per annum. For every Slut do. do. do. ... 10s.

- Any person who shall herd Cattle within the jurisdiction of the Bunbury Municipal Council, and who shall neglect to furnish the Chairman with a correct quarterly statement of the number of Cattle in his herd, and their owners' names, shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Forty shillings.
- All Licenses issued by the Chairman of the Town Council, except in cases otherwise provided for, shall continue in force until the 31st December in each year.
- Any person who shall (without having first obtained the written sanction of the Chairman of the Town Council) cut down, damage, destroy, or injure any Tree, Plant, Post, Fence, Gate, Drain, Water-course, Culvert, Jetty, Wharf, Building, or other property belonging to or in charge of the Council, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding Ten pounds.
- 11. Any person who shall in the course of trade or business, within the boundaries of the Municipality, use any false weights or measures, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding Ten pounds; or any person who shall sell any unlawfully-adulterated spirit or fermented liquor shall forfeit and pay for each and every such offence any sum not exceeding Fifty pounds.
- 12. Any owner or occupier of any land, house, or premises, within the Town boundary, who shall neglect or refuse for fourteen days after due notice from the Chairman of the Council, to abate or remove all nuisances which are or shall arise thereon, or to remove any inflammable building, or pile or stack of wood, or other material dangerous to the adjoining or contiguous property, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding Five pounds.
- Any owners or other person who shall wilfully or negligently allow any horse or other live stock to stray or be at large without keeper within the Town boundary, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence the following fines,

in addition to pound fees and damage by trespass:—

SCALE OF FINES.

For each Entire Horse or Bull at large during the day, above the age of one year, not less than £2 nor more than £4.

For each ditto ditto at large during the night, not less than £3 nor more than £5.

For each Horse, Cattle, or other live stock at large during the day, not less than 5s. nor more than 20s.

For each ditto ditto at large during the night, not less than 10s. nor more than 40s.

14. Any person who shall sell or offer for sale, within the boundaries of the Municipality, any Meat, Fish, or Vegetables, unfit for human food, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10.)

15. Any owner or occupier of any House,

Shop, Store, or other building within the Town boundary, whose roof shall overhang or project over any thoroughfare or footway without having a proper gutter and pipe to carry off the rain, or who shall construct or have any Cornice, Crane, or Hoist, or any other fixture or projection overhanging any footway or thoroughfare, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding Two pounds for every month such nuisance shall remain, after fourteen days' notice to remove the same shall have been given in writing by the Inspector of Nuisances, or the Chairman of the Town Council.
