PROCLAMATION by His Excellency FREDERICK ALOYSIUS WELD, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS it is expedient to establish a New Town in the Swan District, to be called the Town of GINGIN: Now know YE, that I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the authority in me vested, do hereby declare and proclaim that the Town of Gingin shall consist of all that piece or parcel of land situate in what is at present known as the Swan District, containing two hundred and sixty-eight acres, more or less, starting from the point where the South side of the Gingin Brook intersects the East side of the Perth and Gingin road, and bounded as follows, that is to say: on the West by a North-West line of about one chain forty links, and by a North line of thirty-one chains twentyfour links Northward along the East side of said road and road to Brockman's; on the North by thirty-two chains sixty-five links of the South boundary of Swan Location 398, extending Eastward; on the East by a South line of sixteen chains forty links to the West side of a public road, then three chains eighty links along the West side of said road to the North bank of Gingin Brook, thence in a West South-Westerly direction two chains ninety links along the Brook, then by a South line of one chain to the North-West corner of Swan Location 103, then South along West boundary of said Location 103 forty eight chains thirteen links to the

South-East corner of Townsite; on the South by a West line of forty-eight chains sixteen links; on the West by a North line of twenty-four chains, passing along the East boundary of Swan Location 273 to the South bank of Gingin Brook, and finally along said Brook's South bank in a North-Westerly direction to point first described. All bearings herein given true or thereabouts, and measurements more or less.

Given under my hand and seal at Perth, this 11th day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and in the thirty-fifth year of Her Majesty's reign.

ROAD DISTRICTS.

No. 1.—MINES.

Bounded on the *North* by an East and West line from the Murchison River; on the *West* by the Sea Coast; and on the *South* by a line East from the Coast through the Southernmost boundary of the Reserve of 160 acres at the seven mile bridge over the Buller Gully.

No. 2.—GERALDTON.

Bounded on the *North* by the South boundary of the Mines District; on the *West* by the Sea Coast; on the *South* by a line from the mouth of Greenough River to Wizard Peak; and thence by a line due East.

No. 3.—GREENOUGH.

Bounded on the *North* by the South boundary of Geraldton District; on the *West* by the Sea Coast; and on the *South* by a line from the Coast along Wakeford Road through Mount Hill; and thence due East.

No. 4.—IRWIN.

Bounded on the *North* by the South boundary of the Greenough District; on the *West* by the Sea Coast; and on the *South* by an East and West line through Malgah Spring on the inland road between Long's and Mardah Stations.

No. 5.—VICTORIA PLAINS.

Bounded on the North by the South boundary of the Irwin District; on the West by the Sea Coast; on the South by an East and West line from the Coast to Moore River Bridge; thence to Bindoon; thence Southwards, to include the road from Bindoon to Cockman's at junction of Gingin road; thence returning to Bindoon and on to Bolgart, and due East.

No. 6.—SWAN.

Bounded on the North by the South boundary of Victoria Plains District; from the Coast to Bindoon, save and except the road Southwards from Bindoon to Cockman's; thence from Bindoon to the North-West corner of Baylup reserve; thence to junction of Toodyay and Swan roads near Blackadder Creek; thence to junction of York road, including the Swan Road; thence in a South-Westerly direction, excluding the Town of Guildford, to crossing of Perth and Guildford road, on the South-West boundary of Hardey's Location No. 33; thence to South-West corner of South-Eastern end of Swan Location X; thence by a line extending North by West to Junction of the East boundary of Location 104 with Lake Gangarra; thence by a North line; thence by a West line to the Sea Coast through the North end of Lake Nowergup; and on the West by the Sea Coast.

No. 7.—PERTH.

Bounded on the *North* and *East* by the boundaries of the Swan District; on the *South* by the River Swan from Location X to the Sea; and on the *West* by the Sea Coast. To include the Perth and Guildford road to its junction with Swan District, inclusive of Perth Causeway.

No. 8.—TOODYAY.

Bounded on the *North* and *West* by Victoria Plains and Swan Districts; from junction of Swan and Toodyay roads near Blackadder Creek to South-East corner of Warriloo; thence to South boundary of Location 320; thence to Quelquelling; thence by a due East line.

No. 9.—NORTHAM.

Bounded on the *North* by the South boundary of Toodyay District; on the *West* by a line from South-East corner of Warriloo to junction of York and Northam road; thence to Cunderdin Hill; thence a due East line.

No. 10.—YORK.

Bounded on the North by the Southern boundary of Northam District, as far as the junction of York and Northam roads; thence by a line to Warriloo; thence to junction of Swan and Toodyay roads near Blackadder Creek; thence to junction of York road, excluding the Swan road; thence Easterly to the old Half-way House; thence Southerly to Mount Dale; thence to Boyagarring Hill; thence by a North-Easterly line from said Hill to South corner of Avon Location 30; thence by South boundaries of Locations N and O; thence by the Avon River, downwards, by the North boundary of Location H 2; thence by an East-North-Easterly line to Mount Stirling; thence due East.

No. 11.—CANNING.

Bounded on the East and North by the York District; on the South by a line from Mount Dale to the junction of the Bunbury and Albany road at Narrogin Inn; thence by a line to Bull's Creek; thence following the River Canning and Swan to the South-West corner of Swan District and commencement of the first mentioned boundary, exclusive of Perth and Guildford road, to junction of Swan District.

No. 12.—FREMANTLE.

Bounded on the *Northward* by the River Swan from Fremantle to mouth of Canning River, and by a line from Bull's Creek to the junction of the Bunbury and Albany roads at Narrogin Inn. On the *South* by a line from aforesaid junction to Rockingham Townsite; and on the *West* by the Sea Coast. To include Townsite of Rockingham.

No. 13.—MURRAY.

Commencing at the Sea Coast at Rockingham, Southward along the Coast to a point due West from Mount William, then due East through the summit of Mount William to the Murray River; thence up said River to its junction with the Bannister; thence Northerly up the South bank of that River to where the Albany road crosses it, and on to the junction at Narrogin Inn (excluding the Perth-Albany road); thence Westerly along the Southern boundary of Fremantle Road District to the commencing point.

No. 14.—WILLIAMS.

Commencing at the junction of the Bunbury and Albany roads at Narrogin Inn; thence eastward to Mount Dale and on to Boyagarring Hill and southward to the Bannister Townsite; thence due East. Commencing again at first-mentioned point, southward in a line to Bannister River Bridge (to include Perth-Albany road); thence along the South bank of that River to its junction with the Murray; thence up that River to its junction with the Hillman River; thence up that River to its source; thence easterly to the South end of Arthur River Bridge; thence due East.

No. 15.—BEVERLEY.

Bounded on the Northward by the York District; on the Westward by the Williams District; on the Southward by a line due East from Bannister Townsite, the same being the Northern boundary of part of the Williams District.

No. 16.—KOJONUP.

Bounded on the Northward by the South boundary of the Williams District; on the Westward by the West bank of the Arthur River and by a line southward from the junction of the Arthur and Balgarrup Rivers to the North Shore of Lake Matilda; on the Southward by a line from Lake Matilda to Point Hood.

No. 17.—SUSSEX.

Bounded on the Northward by Geographe Bay, and by a due East line passing through the Northern end of Wonnerup Inlet to the Capel River; on the Eastward by the said River upwards to location 171, and a South-easterly line from the South-west corner of that location to the junction of Padbury's Brook with the Blackwood River, and by a line South-easterly to Normalup Inlet; on the Southward and Westward by the Sea Coast.

No. 18.—WELLINGTON.

Bounded on the Northward by the Murray District: on the Eastward by the Williams and Kojonup Districts; on the Westward by the Sea Coast; on the Southward by the Blackwood and Sussex Districts.

No. 19.—BLACKWOOD.

Bounded on the *Northward* by a line extending Eastward from South-west corner of Wellington Location 171, to a point due South from South-east corner of Wellington Location 40; thence North passing along the eastern boundary of said Location 40 to "Gregory's marked line" of road Bunbury to Kojonup; thence by the Kojonup or old Post Road to the West boundary of Kojonup District; on the *Westward* by the Sussex

District; on the Southward by an East-south-easterly line from Manjimup to Perup; thence by an East line to the West Boundary of Kojonup District; on the Eastward by the Kojonup District.

No. 20.—PLANTAGENET.
