IS Excellency The Governor, on the recommendation of the Central Board of Education, has been pleased to approve of an alteration in By-Law No. 32 of the Central Board, under which a reduction of one-fourth the rate of School Fees payable for children attending purely Government Schools has hitherto been made. The By-Law will now stand as follows:—

By-Law 32. The rate of School Fees payable for children attending purely Government Schools shall be regulated according to the following scale:—

Per week per Child.

- 1. When the parent is an employer of labor, or in receipt of an income in excess of £100 per annum ... 1
- 2. When the parent is a Mechanic working on his own account, or Government Official or Mercantile Clerk receiving not more than £100 per annum ... 0 6
- 3. When the parent is a person employed by others at a daily or weekly wage ... 0 3

A reduction of one-third will be made when more than two of one family attend. Special recommendations from District Boards for reduction of Fees will be considered by the Central Board.

THE following amended By-Law, for regulating the proceedings of the Geraldton Municipal Council, to take the place of By-Law No. 19 hitherto-in force, has been confirmed by His Excellency The Governor in Executive Council.

19. That all owners of Town Allotments shall be compelled, on notice from the Chairman of the Council, to erect a brick or stone wall, not less than four feet in height from the level of the road, on both sides of Marine Terrace, extending from Burges Street to Bayly Street; also Gregory Street south to Augustus Street, and Fitzgerald Street south to Sanford Street.
