WESTERN AUSTRALIA, PROCLAMATION by His Excellency FREDERICK ALOYSIUS WELD, Esquire, Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS the second Session of the Legislative Council stands prorogued until the 10th of March, 1872; And Whereas, for divers weighty reasons, it is desirable that the said Legislative Council should be dissolved; Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers and authority in me vested as Governor of the said Colony, I, Frederick Aloysius Weld, do ferely dissolve the Legislative Council of Western Australia from and after the 10th day of March next, and the same stands dissolved accordingly.
