JETTY LIGHT.—PORT] FAIRY.

On and after the fifteenth day of April instant, a green light will be exhibited, from sunset to sunrise, from the end of the Jetty at Port Fairy; the light will be cut, to clear the buoy off the foul ground to the northward of the lighthouse, and will be visible between the bearings of W.S.W. and South at a distance of about three (3) miles.

Vessels entering Port Fairy should steer in until the *green* light on the jetty is opened out when steer for it and anchor.

The best anchorage is in about three (3) fathoms at about a cable's length to the N.W. of the black buoy off the foul ground with the light on Rabbit Island bearing S.S.E.

ALTERATION IN THE CUTTING OF THE LIGHT AT GABO ISLAND.

AT GABO ISLAND.

It having been ascertained that the present cutting of the light on Gabo, Island shows across Cape Howe and does not guide vessels clear of the foul ground in the immediate vicinity, masters of vessels and others navigating that locality are informed that on and after the first day of July next the bearing of the western limit of the light will be altered from S.S.W. to S.W. b. S., so as to clear the dangers to the southward and south-eastward

of Cape Howe.

The light will be visible in clear weather from a ship's deck at a distance of seventeen (17) miles on an arc from E.½N. round northerly to S.W. b. S.
