THE following additional By-Law for regulating the proceedings of the Bunbury Municipal Council has been confirmed by His Excellency The Governor in Executive Council.

16. That fourpence per load be paid to the Collector for each load of earth or sand that may be removed from Waste Lands of the Crown, and Lands in the occupation of the Municipality, within the bounds of the Municipality.

Townsites of Shellborough and Cossack, North District.

> Land Office, Perth, 25th May, 1872.

T is hereby notified that a reserve, having an area of one square mile (six hundred and forty acres), has been set apart for the purpose of a townsite, and a portion of it surveyed into allotments, at Condong, which will from this date be known as "Shellborough."

A townsite reserve of one square mile has also been set out on the land formerly and hitherto known as Suburban Roebourne, and has in part been surveyed into lots, and named "Cossack."

The lands surveyed will be put up and sold by the Government Resident of the North District, or his appointee, in the manner provided by the Land Regulations for the North and East Districts.
