YORK ROAD DISTRICT.

MINOR ROAD No. 6 (Alteration of). Commencing at a bend in the York and Guildford Road, about 28 chains West from the North-east corner of Location 11, proceeding in a South-easterly direction along the Western boundary of Location to the Northern boundary of Location X, then Westerly along the Northern boundary of lastnamed Location.
