T is hereby notified, for general information, that all persons who may desire to cut, fell, or remove Sandalwood from any Waste Lands of the Crown must procure a license to do so from the Collector of Internal Revenue at Perth, or the Resident Magistrate of the District in which they propose to make use of it.

Two Shillings and Sixpence will be charged for each license, which will be in force for one month from the date thereof.

All persons who may cut, fell, or remove Sandalwood without such license as aforesaid, are liable to the penalties named in the 22nd Section of the Act of the Imperial Parliament 24th and 25th Victoria, cap. 97, a copy of which is annexed.

Copy of 22nd Section of the Imperial Act, 24th and 25th Victoria, cap. 97, above referred to.

"If any person shall unlawfully and mali"ciously cut, break, bark, root up, or otherwise
"destroy or damage the whole or any part of
"any tree, sapling, or shrub, or any under"wood, wheresoever the same may be respec"tively growing, the injury done being to the
"amount of one shilling at the least, every
"such offender, being convicted before a
"Justice of the Peace, shall for the first offence
"forfeit and pay, over and above the amount
"of the injury done, such sum of money, not
"exceeding £5, as to the Justice shall seem
"meet; and if any person so convicted shall
"afterwards be guilty of any of the said
"offences, and shall be convicted thereof in
"like manner, every such offender shall for
"such second offence be committed to the
"common gaol or house of correction, there to
"be kept to hard labor for such term, not
"exceeding 12 calendar months, as the con"victing Justice shall think fit; and if such
"second conviction shall take place before two
"Justices, they may further order the offender,

"if a male, to be once or twice publicly or "privately whipped, after the expiration of "four days from the time of such conviction; "and if any person so twice convicted shall "afterwards commit any of the said offences, "such offender shall be deemed guilty of "felony, and being convicted thereof, shall be "liable to any of the punishments which the "Court may award for the felony hereinbefore "last mentioned."

Chief Secretary's Office, Melbourne, 17th July, 1872.

SIR,-I have the honor to bring under your SIR,—I have the honor to bring under your notice that a person named Thomas Hiden, who was arrested at Williamstown on the charge of having arrived in this Colony contrary to the provisions of the Act to prevent the influx of Criminals into Victoria, pleaded in his defence that his term of imprisonment had arrived in 1870, in evidence of which he had expired in 1870, in evidence of which he produced a Certificate under the hand of the Collector of Customs at Fremantle, shewing that "he was a free man and at liberty to "leave Western Australia for any part of Her "Market and the control of "Majesty's dominions."

Hiden was convicted of the charge, ordered to be conveyed in custody back to Western Australia, and the master of the schooner by which he came to Melbourne was convicted of a breach of the Act, and fined in the sum of £10.

As clearances similar to that given by the Collector of Customs are evidently calculated to mislead the persons to whom they are given, and expose them to punishment, I take the opportunity of suggesting, as this is not the first instance of the kind that has recently occurred, that you will be good enough to take due measures to let it be known that the possession of such a Certificate will not exempt persons whose terms of imprisonment have expired from being arrested, should they come to this Colony, and on conviction punished under the provisions of the Act in question.
