T is hereby ordered and directed, that on and after the First day of January next, all those areas of land which from time to time have been set apart by notification in *The Western Australian Government Gazette*, as for Special Occupation, are abandoned, and all such notifications cancelled, save and except over the lands within those areas which may be licensed and let before such date.
