- 1. From Bunbury to Busselton.
- 2. From Busselton to Lower Blackwood Bridge.
- 3. From Busselton towards Dunsbro to the West side of Sussex Location 13, and extending South along the West boundary of said Location 13 to Quindalup.

MINOR.

- 1. From Lower Blackwood Bridge to Warren River.
- 2. From Busselton to Augusta, $vi\hat{a}$ Lennox and Margaret Rivers.
- 3. From the North-west corner of Sussex Location 13 to Cape Naturaliste, viâ Dunsbro.
- 4. From Busselton to Augusta, passing through Busselton Commonage.
 5. From the Branch Road leaving the Main
- From the Branch Road leaving the Main Bunbury and Busselton Road at a short distance North of Abba Bridge, passing through Sussex Location 31, extending in a North-westerly direction to Lockville.
 From St. John's Brook to Padbury Bridge,
- From St. John's Brook to Padbury Bridge, via Dudinyillup.

Land for Special Occupation with defined Areas.

T is hereby ordered and directed, that on and after the First day of January next, all those areas of land which from time to time have been set apart by notification in *The Western Australian Government Gazette*, as for Special Occupation, are abandoned, and all such notifications cancelled, save and except over the

lands within those areas which may be licensed and let before such date.

To better encourage the settlement of the Agricultural Lands of the Colony under the Special Occupation System, blocks of not less than One hundred acres, in the contiguity of roads or of the centres of population, may be thrown open for selection, on its being shown to the Commissioner of Crown Lands that they are of the proper character and description.

No Commonage or right to graze any live stock outside the land actually contained in the license will be directly granted; but any common lands hereafter needed will be made by Special Reserve, under powers given in the Land Regulations.
