# Special Occupation Lands.

## NOTICE.

Commissioner of Crown Lands' Office, Perth, 30th August, 1872.

O Commonage, or right to graze any description of live stock, has been, is, or will be, conveyed or allowed to any Licensee of "Special Occupation Land" by the License, excepting, of course, over the land actually comprised therein.

MALCOLM FRASER, Commissioner of Crown Lands. Land for Special Occupation with defined Areas.

T is hereby ordered and directed, that on and after the First day of January next, all those areas of land which from time to time have been set apart by notification in The Western Australian Government Gazette, as for Special Occupation, are abandoned, and all such notifications cancelled, save and except over the lands within those areas which may be licensed and let before such date.

To better encourage the settlement of the Agricultural Lands of the Colony under the Special Occupation System, blocks of not less than One hundred acres, in the contiguity of roads or of the centres of population, may be thrown open for selection, on its being shown to the Commissioner of Crown Lands that they are of the proper character and description.

No Commonage or right to graze any live stock outside the land actually contained in the license will be directly granted; but any common lands hereafter needed will be made by Special Reserve, under powers given in the Land Regulations.

LXXIII.—NELSON DISTRICT (Davis & Homewood).

Bounded on the West by a North line of 50 chains from a spot on the North boundary of Nelson location 38, where it is intersected by the road from Bunbury to Bridgetown.
